HOUSE FILE 548

AN ACT

4 RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TRAINING AT THE IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY, AND PROVIDING FOR A FEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 80B.3, subsection 3, Code 2003, is 1 10 amended to read as follows:

- "Law enforcement officer" means an officer appointed by 1 12 the director of the department of natural resources, a member 1 13 of a police force or other agency or department of the state, 14 county, or tribal government regularly employed as 1 15 such and who is responsible for the prevention and detection 1 16 of crime and the enforcement of the criminal laws of this 17 state and all individuals, as determined by the council, who 1 18 by the nature of their duties may be required to perform the 1 19 duties of a peace officer.
 - 20 Sec. 2. Section 80B.11, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2003, 21 are amended to read as follows:
- 1. Minimum entrance requirements, course of study, 1 23 attendance requirements, and equipment and facilities required 24 at approved law enforcement training schools. Minimum age 25 requirements for entrance to approved law enforcement training 1 26 schools shall be eighteen years of age. Minimum course of 27 study requirements shall include a separate domestic abuse 28 curriculum, which may include, but is not limited to, outside 1 29 speakers from domestic abuse shelters and crime victim 30 assistance organizations. Minimum course of study
- requirements shall also include a sexual assault curriculum. 2. Minimum basic training requirements law enforcement 32 1 33 officers employed after July 1, 1968, must complete in order 34 to remain eligible for continued employment and the time 35 within which such basic training must be completed. Minimum 1 requirements shall mandate training devoted to the topic of 2 domestic abuse <u>and sexual assault</u>. The council shall submit 3 an annual report to the general assembly by January 15 of each 4 year relating to the continuing education requirements devoted 5 to the topic of domestic abuse, including the number of hours 6 required, the substance of the classes offered, and other 7 related matters.
 - Sec. 3. Section 80B.11B, subsection 2, Code 2003, is 9 amended to read as follows:
- 2 10 2. The Iowa law enforcement academy may also charge the department of natural resources or other agency or department 12 of the state, a member of a police force of a city or county, 13 or any political subdivision of the state not more than one= 2 14 half of the cost of providing the basic training course which 2 15 is designed to meet the minimum basic training requirements 16 for a law enforcement officer. All other candidates to the 17 law enforcement academy, including a candidate from a tribal 18 government, shall pay the full costs of providing the basic 19 training requirements for a law enforcement officer.
 20 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 80B.18 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ==
- 2 21 TRIBAL GOVERNMENT.
- A law enforcement officer who is a member of a police force 23 of a tribal government and who becomes certified through the 2 24 Iowa law enforcement academy shall be subject to the 2 25 certification and revocation of certification rules and 26 procedures as provided in this chapter. The certified law 27 enforcement officer shall be subject to the jurisdiction of 28 the courts of this state if an agreement exists between the 29 tribal government and the state or between the tribal 30 government and a county, which grants authority to the law 31 enforcement officer to act in a law enforcement capacity off a 32 settlement or reservation.
