		department of elder affairs establish policy for adult day services programs and that the department of inspections and
2		appeals enforce this chapter.

		with chapter 17A, a program for certification and monitoring of and complaint investigations related to adult day services
		programs. The department, in establishing standards for adult

3 6 establish or operate an adult day services program and shall 3 7 not represent an adult day services program to the public as 3 8 certified unless and until the program is certified pursuant 3 9 to this chapter. If an adult day services program is 3 10 voluntarily accredited by a recognized accrediting entity with 3 11 specific adult day services standards, the department of 3 12 inspections and appeals shall accept voluntary accreditation 3 13 as the basis for certification by the department. The owner 3 14 or manager of a certified adult day services program shall 3 15 comply with the rules adopted by the department for an adult 3 16 day services program. 3 17 2. An adult day services program may provide any type of 3 18 adult day services for which the program is certified, 3 19 including any special classification of adult day services. 3 20 An adult day services program shall provide services and 3 21 supervision commensurate with the needs of the recipients. An 3 22 adult day services program shall not provide services to 3 23 individuals requiring a level or type of services for which 3 24 the program is not certified and services provided shall not 3 25 exceed the level or type of services for which the program is 3 26 certified. 3 27 3. An adult day services program that has been certified 3 28 by the department of inspections and appeals shall not alter 29 the program, operation, or adult day services for which the 30 program is certified in a manner that affects continuing 3 3 3 31 certification without prior approval of the department of 32 inspections and appeals. A department, agency, or officer of this state or of any governmental unit shall not pay or approve for payment from public funds any amount to an adult day services program 3 35 4 1 4 2 3 for an actual or perspective recipient, unless the program 4 4 holds a current certificate issued by the department of 5 inspections and appeals and meets all current requirements for 4 4 4 6 certification. 4 7 5. The department shall adopt rules regarding the 4 8 conducting or operating of another business or activity in the 9 distinct part of the physical structure in which the adult day 4 4 10 services program is provided, if the business or activity 4 11 serves nonrecipients of adult day services. The rules shall 4 12 be developed in consultation with the department of 4 13 inspections and appeals and affected industry, professional, 4 14 and consumer groups. (4) For an optional preliminary plan review, five hundred 4 33 4 34 dollars. 4 NEW SECTION. 231D.5 DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR 35 Sec. 5. 5 REVOCATION. 1 5 2 1. The department of inspections and appeals may deny, suspend, or revoke certification if the department of 5 3 5 4 inspections and appeals finds that there has been a 5 5 substantial or repeated failure on the part of the adult day 5 6 services program to comply with this chapter or the rules or 5 7 minimum standards adopted pursuant to this chapter, or for any 5 8 of the following reasons: 5 9 a. Cruelty or indifference to adult day services program 5 10 service recipients. 5 b. Appropriation or conversion of the property of an adult 11 5 12 day services programs service recipient without the 5 13 recipient's written consent or the written consent of the 14 service recipient's legal guardian. 5 5 15 c. Permitting, aiding, or abetting the commission of any 5 16 illegal act in the adult day services program.

5 17 d. Obtaining or attempting to obtain or retain 5 18 certification by fraudulent means, misrepresentation, or by 5 19 submitting false information. e. Habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs 5 20 5 21 by the applicant, owner, manager, or supervisor of the adult 5 22 day services program. 23 f. Securing the devise or bequest of the property of a 24 recipient of services of an adult day services program by 5 5 5 25 undue influence. 5 26 g. Failure or neglect to maintain a continuing education 5 27 and training program for all personnel employed in the adult 5 28 day services program. 5 29 h. Founded dependent adult abuse as defined in section 5 30 235B.2. 5 31 i. For any other reason as provided by law or 5 32 administrative rule. 5 33 2. In the case of an application by an existing 5 34 certificate holder for a new or newly acquired adult day 5 35 services program, continuing or repeated failure of the 6 certificate holder to operate any previously certified adult 1 б 2 day services program in compliance with this chapter or of the 6 3 rules adopted pursuant to this chapter. 6 4 3. In the case of a certificate applicant or existing 5 certificate holder which is an entity other than an 6 individual, the department of inspections and appeals may б 6 7 deny, suspend, or revoke a certificate if any individual who 6 б 8 is in a position of control or is an officer of the entity engages in any act or omission proscribed by this section. Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.6 NOTICE == APPEAL == б 9 6 10 6 11 EMERGENCY PROVISIONS. 6 12 1. The denial, suspension, or revocation of a certificate 6 13 shall be effected by delivering to the applicant or 6 14 certificate holder by restricted certified mail or by personal 6 15 service a notice setting forth the particular reasons for the 6 16 action. The denial, suspension, or revocation shall become 6 17 effective thirty days after the mailing or service of the 6 18 notice, unless the applicant or certificate holder, within the 6 19 thirty=day period, requests a hearing, in writing, of the 6 20 department of inspections and appeals, in which case the 6 21 notice shall be deemed to be suspended. 6 2. The denial, suspension, or revocation of a certificate 22 6 23 may be appealed in accordance with rules adopted by the 6 24 department of inspections and appeals in accordance with 6 25 chapter 17A. 6 26 3. When the department of inspections and appeals finds 6 27 that an immediate danger to the health or safety of recipients 6 28 of services from an adult day services program exists which 6 29 requires action on an emergency basis, the department of 6 30 inspections and appeals may direct the removal of all 6 31 recipients of services from an adult day services program and 32 suspend the certificate prior to a hearing. 33 Sec. 7. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.7 CONDITION 6 6 CONDITIONAL OPERATION. The department of inspections and appeals may, as an б 34 6 7 35 alternative to denial, suspension, or revocation of certification under section 231D.5, conditionally issue or 7 2 continue certification dependent upon the performance by the 7 3 adult day services program of reasonable conditions within a 7 4 reasonable period of time as prescribed by the department of 7 5 inspections and appeals so as to permit the program to 7 6 commence or continue the operation of the program pending full 7 7 compliance with this chapter or the rules adopted pursuant to 7 8 this chapter. If the adult day services program does not make 9 diligent efforts to comply with the conditions prescribed, the 7 7 10 department of inspections and appeals may, under the 7 11 proceedings prescribed by this chapter, suspend or revoke the 7 12 certificate. An adult day services program shall not be 7 13 operated under conditional certification for more than one 7 14 year. 7 15 231D.8 DEPARTMENT NOTIFIED OF Sec. 8. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 7 16 CASUALTIES. 7 The department of inspections and appeals shall be notified 17 7 18 within twenty=four hours, by the most expeditious means 7 19 available, of any accident causing substantial injury or 7 20 death, and any substantial fire or natural or other disaster 21 occurring at or near an adult day services program. 22 Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.9 COMPLAINTS AND 7 7 2.2 7 23 CONFIDENTIALITY. 7 1. A person with concerns regarding the operations or 2.4 25 service delivery of an adult day services program may file a 26 complaint with the department of inspections and appeals. The 7 7 7 27 name of the person who files a complaint with the department

7 28 of inspections and appeals and any personal identifying 7 29 information of the person or any recipient of program services 7 30 identified in the complaint shall be kept confidential and 31 shall not be subject to discovery, subpoena, or other means of 32 legal compulsion for its release to a person other than 7 7 7 33 employees of the department of inspections and appeals 7 34 involved in the investigation of the complaint. 7 35 2. The department, in cooperation with the department of 8 inspections and appeals, shall establish procedures for the 8 2 disposition of complaints received in accordance with this 8 3 section. Sec. 10. 8 4 NEW SECTION. 231D.10 PUBLIC DISCLOSURE OF 8 5 FINDINGS. Following a monitoring evaluation or complaint investigation of an adult day services program by the 8 6 8 7 8 8 department of inspections and appeals pursuant to this 8 9 chapter, the department's final findings with respect to 8 10 compliance by the adult day services program with requirements 8 11 for certification shall be made available to the public in a 8 12 readily available form and place. Other information relating 13 to an adult day services program that is obtained by the 8 8 14 department of inspections and appeals which does not 8 15 constitute the department's final findings from a monitoring 8 16 evaluation or complaint investigation of the adult day 8 17 services program shall not be made available to the public 8 18 except in proceedings involving the denial, suspension, or 8 19 revocation of a certificate under this chapter. 8 20 NEW SECTION. 231D.11 PENALTIES. Sec. 11. 8 21 1. A person establishing, conducting, managing, or 8 22 operating an adult day services program without a certificate 8 23 is guilty of a serious misdemeanor. Each day of continuing 8 24 violation after conviction or notice from the department of 8 25 inspections and appeals by certified mail of a violation shall 26 be considered a separate offense or chargeable offense. 8 А 8 27 person establishing, conducting, managing, or operating an 8 28 adult day services program without a certificate may be 8 29 temporarily or permanently restrained by a court of competent 8 30 jurisdiction from such activity in an action brought by the 8 31 state. 8 32 2. A person who prevents or interferes with or attempts to 33 impede in any way any duly authorized representative of the 34 department of inspections and appeals in the lawful 8 8 35 enforcement of this chapter or of the rules adopted pursuant 8 9 1 to this chapter is guilty of a simple misdemeanor. As used in 9 2 this subsection, lawful enforcement includes but is not 9 3 limited to: 9 4 a. Contacting or interviewing any participant of an adult 9 5 day services program in private at any reasonable hour and 9 without advance notice. 6 9 7 Examining any relevant records of an adult day services b. 9 8 program. 9 9 c. Preserving evidence of any violation of this chapter or 10 of the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter. 9 9 11 3. A civil penalty, as established by rule, may apply in 9 12 any of the following situations: 9 13 a. Program noncompliance with one or more regulatory 9 14 requirements has caused or is likely to cause harm, serious 9 15 injury, threat, or death to a recipient of program services. 16 b. Program failure or refusal to comply with regulatory 9 16 9 17 requirements within prescribed time frames. 9 18 Sec. 12. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D 9 19 DAY SERVICES PROGRAM PROHIBITED. 231D.12 RETALIATION BY AN ADULT 9 20 1. An adult day services program shall not discriminate or 9 21 retaliate in any way against a recipient, recipient's family, 9 22 or an employee of the program who has initiated or 9 23 participated in any proceeding authorized by this chapter. An 9 24 adult day services program that violates this section is 9 25 subject to a penalty as established by administrative rule, to 9 26 be assessed and collected by the department of inspections and 9 27 appeals and paid into the state treasury to be credited to the 9 28 general fund of the state. 9 29 Any attempt to discharge a recipient from an adult day 9 30 services program by whom or upon whose behalf a complaint has 9 31 been submitted to the department of inspections and appeals 32 under section 231D.9, within ninety days after the filing of 33 the complaint or the conclusion of any proceeding resulting 9 9 9 34 from the complaint, shall raise a rebuttable presumption that 9 35 the action was taken by the program in retaliation for the 1 filing of the complaint, except in situations in which the 2 recipient is discharged due to changes in health status which 10 10 10 3 exceed the level of care offered by the adult day services

4 program or in other situations as specified by rule. Sec. 13. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.13 NURSING ASSISTANT AND 10 5 10 6 MEDICATION AIDE == CERTIFICATION. 7 The department of inspections and appeals, in cooperation 8 with other appropriate agencies, shall establish a procedure 10 10 10 9 to allow nursing assistants or medication aides to claim work 10 10 within adult day services programs as credit toward sustaining 10 11 the nursing assistant's or medication aide's certification. 231D.14 CRIMINAL RECORDS 10 12 Sec. 14. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 10 13 INVESTIGATION CHECK. 10 14 An adult day services program shall comply with section 10 15 135C.33. 10 16 Sec. 15. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.15 FIRE AND SAFETY STANDARDS. 10 17 The state fire marshal shall adopt rules, in coordination 10 18 with the department of elder affairs and the department of 10 19 inspections and appeals, relating to the certification and 10 20 monitoring of the fire and safety standards of adult day 10 21 services programs. services programs. Sec. 16. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231D.16 TRANSITION PROVISIONS. 1. Adult day services programs voluntarily accredited by a 10 22 10 23 10 24 recognized accrediting entity prior to July 1, 2003, shall 10 25 comply with this chapter by June 30, 2004. 10 26 2. Adult day services programs that are serving at least two but not more than five persons that are not voluntarily accredited by a recognized accrediting entity prior to July 1, 2003, shall comply with this chapter by June 30, 2005. 10 27 10 28 10 29 10 30 Sec. 17. Section 100.1, subsection 6, Code 2003, is 10 31 amended to read as follows: 10 32 6. To adopt rules designating a fee to be assessed to each 10 33 building, structure, or facility for which a fire safety 34 inspection or plan review by the state fire marshal is 10 10 35 required as a condition of licensure by law. EFFECTIVE DATE.
