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   7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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         Section 1. GOAL OF IOWA'S LONG=TERM CARE SYSTEM. The
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  10 general assembly finds and declares that the goal of Iowa's
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  11 long=term care system is to ensure residents access to an
1 12 extensive range of high=quality long=term care options that
1 13 maximize independence, choice, and dignity through the
  14 development of a comprehensive system of community=based and
1 15 institutional long=term care options that provide affordable,
1 16 high-quality, cost-effective services and other supports
1 17 delivered in the most integrated, life-enhancing setting. The
1 18 general assembly finds and declares that information regarding
1 19 all components of the long-term care system must be
  20 effectively communicated to all those potentially impacted by
  21 the need for long=term care in order to empower consumers to
1 22 make decisions about how best to meet their own long=term care
1 23 needs.

                  BENCHMARKS. The following benchmarks shall be
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  25 used in measuring the state's progress in realizing its goal
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1 26 for the long=term care system:
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         1. Reducing the number of nursing home beds from the
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  28 current ninety=one per one thousand persons for individuals
1 29 sixty=five years of age or older.
         2. Increasing the percentage of Medicaid long=term care
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  31 dollars expended on community=based services.
         3. Increasing the proportion of Medicaid long=term care
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1 33 dollars expended on consumer=directed care.
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  34 4. Increasing the percent of providers having and using 35 consumer satisfaction surveys.
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         5. Reducing the use of nursing homes for individuals
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   2 sixty=five years of age and older who have relatively few
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   3 disabilities.
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        6. Improving satisfaction with the long-term care system
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   5 by both providers and consumers.
     7. Increasing the proportion of frail elders receiving assistance from family caregivers.
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        8. Increasing the proportion of Iowans with private long=
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   9 term care insurance coverage.
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         Sec. 3. LONG=TERM CARE SYSTEM TASK FORCE.
         1. A long=term care system task force is created
2 12 consisting of the following members:
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         a. Five members of the senate and five members of the
2 14 house of representatives, serving as voting members. The 2 15 legislative members shall be appointed by the majority leader
2 16 of the senate, after consultation with the president of the 2 17 senate and the minority leader of the senate, and by the
2 18 speaker of the house, after consultation with the majority
  19 leader and the minority leader of the house of
  20 representatives. Appointments shall comply with sections 21 69.16 and 69.16A. Vacancies shall be filled by the original
  22 appointing authority and in the manner of the original
  23 appointment.
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        b. A representative of the governor's office, serving as
  25 an ex officio, nonvoting member.
         c. An individual with expertise in long=term care,
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  27 selected by the legislative council, serving as an ex officio,
2 28 nonvoting member.
  d. The director of human services, the director of public health, the director of the department of elder affairs, and
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2 31 the director of the department of inspections and appeals, or
2 32 the directors' designees, serving as ex officio, nonvoting
  33 members.
         2. Nonlegislative members shall receive actual expenses
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  35 incurred while serving in their official capacity.
   1 Legislative members shall receive per diem compensation and
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3. The individual with expertise in long=term care, 4 selected by the legislative council, shall act as chairperson 5 of the task force. A majority of the voting members of the
