The above Senate Files are hereby approved this date.



## AN ACT

PROVIDING FOR THE ANIMAL UNIT CAPACITY OF FOWL FOR PURPOSES OF REGULATION UNDER THE ANIMAL AGRICULTURE COMPLIANCE ACT, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 459.102, subsection 6, paragraphs h and i, Code 2003, are amended to read as follows:

h. Turkeys weighing one hundred twelve ounces

<u>or more</u> ..... 0.018 <u>i. Turkeys weighing less than one hundred</u>

twelve ounces ..... 0.0085 i. j. Broiler-or-layer-chickens Chickens weighing

<u>forty-eight ounces or more</u> ..... 0.010 <u>k. Chickens weighing less than forty-eight</u>

ounces ..... 0.0025
