AN ACT

4 PROVIDING FOR VETERINARY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 163.3, Code 2005, is amended to read as

VETERINARY ASSISTANTS.

The department secretary or the secretary's designee may 1 13 appoint one or more $\frac{1icensed}{1}$ veterinarians $\frac{1icensed}{1}$ pursuant 1 14 to chapter 169 in each county as assistant veterinarians. 1 15 The secretary may also appoint such special assistants as may 1 16 be necessary in cases of emergency, including as provided in 1 17 section 163.3A.

NEW SECTION. 163.3A VETERINARY EMERGENCY

- 1 20 1. The department may provide veterinary emergency 1 21 preparedness and response services necessary to prevent or 1 22 control a serious threat to the public health, public safety, 1 23 or the state's economy caused by the transmission of disease 24 among livestock as defined in section 717.1 or agricultural 25 animals as defined in section 717A.1. The services may 1 26 include measures necessary to ensure that that all such 27 animals carrying disease are properly identified, segregated, 28 treated, or destroyed as provided in this Code.
 - 2. The services shall be performed under the direction of 30 the department and may be part of measures authorized by the 31 governor under a declaration or proclamation issued pursuant 32 to chapter 29C. In such case, the department shall cooperate 33 with the Iowa department of public health under chapter 135; 34 and the department of public defense, homeland security and 35 emergency management division; and local emergency management 1 agencies as provided in chapter 29C.
- 3. The secretary or the secretary's designee shall appoint 3 veterinarians licensed pursuant to chapter 169 or persons in 4 related professions or occupations who are qualified, as 5 determined by the secretary, to serve on a voluntary basis as 6 members of one or more veterinary emergency response teams.
 7 The secretary shall provide for the registration of persons as 8 part of the appointment process. The secretary may cooperate 9 with the Iowa board of veterinary medicine in implementing 2 10 this section.
- 4. a. A registered member of an emergency response team 12 who acts under the authority of the secretary shall be 13 considered an employee of the state for purposes of defending 2 14 a claim on account of damage to or loss of property or on 2 15 account of personal injury or death under chapter 669. 2 16 registered member shall be afforded protection under section 2 17 669.21. The registered member shall also be considered an 2 18 employee of the state for purposes of disability, workers' 19 compensation, and death benefits under chapter 85.
 - b. The department shall provide and update a list of the 21 registered members of each emergency response team, including 22 the members' names and identifying information, to the 23 department of administrative services. Upon notification of a 24 compensable loss suffered by a registered member, the 25 department of administrative services shall seek funding from 26 the executive council for those costs associated with covered 27 benefits.
