All wearing apparel of the debtor and the debtor's 13 dependents kept for actual use and the trunks or other 1 12 1 1 14 receptacles necessary for the wearing apparel, not to exceed 1 15 in value one thousand dollars in the aggregate. In addition, 1 16 the The debtor's interest in: 1 17 <u>a. any Any</u> wedding or engagement ring owned and <u>or</u> 1 18 received by the debtor or the debtor's dependents on or before 19 the date of marriage. However, any interest acquired in one 20 or more wedding or engagement rings owned or received by the 21 debtor or the debtor's dependents after the date of marriage 22 and within two years of the date the execution is issued or an 23 exemption is claimed shall not exceed a value equal to seven 24 thousand dollars in the aggregate minus the amount claimed by 25 the debtor for any other jewelry claimed in paragraph "b".
26 b. All jewelry of the debtor and the debtor's dependents 1 26 27 owned or received by the debtor or the debtor's dependents, 28 not to exceed in value two thousand dollars in the aggregate. 29 The debtor's interest in all wearing apparel of the 5. 30 debtor and the debtor's dependents kept for actual use and the 31 trunks or other receptacles necessary for the wearing apparel, <u>1 32 musical instruments,</u> household furnishings, <u>and</u> household 1 33 goods <del>and</del> <u>which include, but are not limited to</u>, appliances, 34 radios, television sets, record or tape playing machines, <u>35 compact disc players, satellite dishes, cable television</u> <u>1 equipment, computers, software, printers, digital video disc</u> 2 players, video players, and cameras held primarily for the 2 3 personal, family, or household use of the debtor or a 2 4 dependent of the debtor and the debtor's dependents, not to 2 5 exceed in value two seven thousand dollars in the aggregate. 2 6 9. Any combination of the following, not to exceed a value 7 of five thousand dollars in the aggregate The debtor's 8 interest in the following: 2 9 a. Musical instruments, not including radios, television 2 10 sets, or record or tape playing machines, held primarily for 2 11 the personal, family, or household use of the debtor or a 2 12 dependent of the debtor. 2 13 b. One motor vehicle, not to exceed in value seven 14 thousand dollars in the aggregate. 15 <del>c.</del> <u>b.</u> In the event of a bankruptcy proceeding, the 2 15 2 16 debtor's interest in accrued wages and in state and federal 2 17 tax refunds as of the date of filing of the petition in 2 18 bankruptcy, not to exceed one thousand dollars in the 2 19 aggregate. This exemption is in addition to the limitations 2 20 contained in sections 642.21 and 537.5105. 2 21 13. The debtor's interest, not to exceed one <del>hundred</del> 2 22 <u>thousand</u> dollars in the aggregate, in any cash on hand, bank 2 23 deposits, credit union share drafts, or other deposits, 24 wherever situated, or other personal property not otherwise 25 specifically provided for in this chapter. 26 Sec. 2. Section 627.6, Code 2005, is amended by adding the 2 2 2 26 2 27 following new subsection: NEW SUBSECTION. 15.
