1 10 Supplement 2005, are amended to read as follows:
1 11 5. "Alcoholic liquor" or "intoxicating liquor" means the 1 12 varieties of liquor defined in subsections 3 and 33 which 1 13 contain more than five percent of alcohol by weight, beverages
1 14 made as described in subsection 7 which beverages contain more
1 15 than five percent of alcohol by weight but which are not wine 1 16 as defined in subsection 37, and every other liquid or solid,
1 17 patented or not, containing spirits and every beverage
1 18 obtained by the process described in subsection 37 containing
  19 more than seventeen percent alcohol by weight or twenty=one
   20 and twenty=five hundredths percent of alcohol by volume, and
1 21 susceptible of being consumed by a human being, for beverage 1 22 purposes. Alcohol manufactured in this state for use as fuel 1 23 pursuant to an experimental distilled spirits plant permit or
1 24 its equivalent issued by the federal bureau of alcohol,
  25 tobacco and firearms is not an "alcoholic liquor".
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           37. "Wine" means any beverage containing more than five
1 27 percent but not more than seventeen percent of alcohol by
  28 weight or twenty=one and twenty=five hundredths percent of
1 29 alcohol by volume obtained by the fermentation of the natural 1 30 sugar contents of fruits or other agricultural products but
1 31 excluding any product containing alcohol derived from malt or
  32 by the distillation process from grain, cereal, molasses, or
  33 cactus.
          Sec. 2. Section 123.173, subsection 2, Code 2005, is
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    3 wine as defined in section 123.3, subsection 37. The holder
    4 of a class "A" wine permit may manufacture in this state wine 5 having an alcoholic content greater than seventeen percent by
    6 weight or twenty=one and twenty=five hundredths percent of
   7 alcohol by volume for shipment outside this state. All class 8 "A" premises shall be located within the state. A class "B"
    9 or class "B" native wine permit allows the holder to sell wine
2 10 at retail for consumption off the premises. A class "B" or
2 11 class "B" native wine permittee who also holds a class "E" 2 12 liquor control license may sell wine to class "A", class "B", 2 13 and class "C" liquor control licensees for resale for
2 14 consumption on the premises. Such wine sales shall be in 2 15 quantities of less than one case of any wine brand but not
2 16 more than one such sale shall be made to the same liquor
2 17 control licensee in a twenty=four=hour period. A class "B" or 2 18 class "B" native wine permittee shall not sell wine to other 2 19 class "B", or class "B" native wine permittees. A class "C"
2 20 native wine permit allows the holder to sell wine for
   21 consumption on or off the premises.
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           Sec. 3. Section 123.182, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code
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  23 2005, is amended to read as follows:
  The label on a bottle or other container in which wine is 25 offered for sale in this state, which label represents the
2 26 alcoholic content of the wine as being in excess of seventeen
2 27 percent by weight or twenty=one and twenty=five hundredths 2 28 percent of alcohol by volume, is conclusive evidence of the 2 29 alcoholic content of that wine.

  31 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
32 NEW PARAGRAPH. c. A premises covered by a class "A" wine
33 permit or a class "B" wine permit as provided in chapter 123.
