1 4 RELATING TO THE ACTIVITIES OF THE GRAPE AND WINE DEVELOPMENT
1 5 COMMISSION, AND PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF WINE GALLONAGE
1 6 TAX REVENUES TO THE GRAPE AND WINE DEVELOPMENT FUND.

1 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
1 9

1 10 Section 1. Section 123.183, subsection 3, paragraph a,
1 11 Code 2005, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting
1 12 in lieu thereof the following:

1 13 a. Five percent of the revenue collected from the wine
1 14 gallonage tax on wine imported into this state for sale at
1 15 wholesale and sold in this state at wholesale shall be
1 16 deposited in the grape and wine development fund as created in
1 17 section 175A.5.

1 18 Sec. 2. Section 175A.3, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
1 19 2005, is amended to read as follows:

1 20 a. Establish and administer grape and wine development
1 21 programs as provided in section 175A.4 and account for and
1 22 expend moneys from the grape and wine development fund created
1 23 pursuant to section 175A.5. Prior to authorizing an

1 24 expenditure of moneys, the department shall consult with the
1 25 grape and wine development commission. The commission shall

1 26 make recommendations to the department regarding the

1 27 expenditure of moneys to enhance and develop the native wine

1 28 industry and to provide an infrastructure to encourage the

1 29 growth of the native wine industry in this state.

1 30 Sec. 3. Section 175A.3, subsection 2, Code 2005, is
1 31 amended by adding the following new paragraph:

1 32 NEW PARAGRAPH. f. Make recommendations to the department
1 33 regarding a proposed expenditure of funds as provided in
1 34 subsection 1, paragraph "a".
