Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 547A.2 MISUSE OF NAME == PENALTY.

1. A person who uses the name, trademark, logo, or symbol 1 16 1 17 1 18 of a financial institution or insurer in connection with the 1 19 sale, offering for sale, distribution, or advertising of any 1 20 product or service without the consent of the financial 1 21 institution or insurer, if such use is misleading or deceptive 1 22 as to the source of origin or sponsorship of, or the 1 23 affiliation with, the product or service, is guilty of a 24 serious misdemeanor. 2. A financial institution or insurer may bring an action 2.5 1 26 to enjoin the misleading or deceptive use prohibited in 1 27 subsection 1 and recover all damages suffered by reason of the 1 28 prohibited use, including reasonable attorney fees. The 1 29 financial institution or insurer may recover any profits 1 30 derived from the prohibited use. The state agency with 31 regulatory authority over the financial institution or insurer 1 32 may also bring an action to enjoin the misleading or deceptive 1 33 use prohibited in subsection 1.
