
RELATING TO HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES FOR CERTAIN VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 483A.24, subsection 13, Code Supplement 2005, is amended to read as follows:


13. Upon payment of the fee of ~~thirty~~ five dollars for a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting and fishing combined license, the department shall issue a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting and fishing combined license to a resident of Iowa who is a veteran, as defined in section 35.1, or served in the armed forces of the United States for a minimum aggregate of ninety days of active federal service and who was disabled or was a prisoner of war during that veteran's military service. The department shall prepare an application to be used by a person requesting a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting and fishing combined license under this subsection. The department of veterans affairs shall assist the department in verifying the status or claims of applicants under this subsection. As used

in this subsection, "disabled" means entitled to compensation under the United States Code, Title 38, ch. 11.


