

HOUSE FILE 2768

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE STATE MEDICAL EXAMINER TO COLLECT AND RETAIN FEES FOR MEDICAL EXAMINER FACILITY EXPENSES AND SERVICES RELATED TO TISSUE RECOVERY AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 691.6, Code Supplement 2005, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 8. To collect and retain fees for medical examiner facility expenses and services related to tissue recovery. Fees collected and retained under this subsection are appropriated to the state medical examiner for purposes of supporting the state medical examiner's office and shall not be transferred, used, obligated, or otherwise encumbered. Notwithstanding section 8.33, any fees collected by the state

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medical examiner shall not revert to the general fund of the state or any other fund.
