SENATE FILE 370

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DURATION OF A NO-CONTACT ORDER IN A CRIMINAL  
CASE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 901.5, subsection 7A, paragraph b,  
unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2005, is amended to read as  
follows:


The duration of the no-contact order may extend for a  
period of five years from the date the judgment is entered or  
the deferred judgment is granted, or up to the maximum term of  
confinement plus one additional year, whichever is greater.

The court may order the no-contact order regardless of whether the defendant is placed on probation.
