1 4 RELATING TO AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS INVOLVING STATE  
1 5 GOVERNMENT, BY PROVIDING FOR AGRICULTURE, NATURAL  
1 6 RESOURCES, AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

1 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 10 DIVISION I  
1 11 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP  
1 12 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS  
1 13 Section 1. GENERAL FUND == DEPARTMENT. There is  
1 14 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
1 15 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal  
1 16 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
1 17 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
1 18 used for the purposes designated:  
1 19 For purposes of supporting the department, including its  
1 20 divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for  
1 21 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes;  
1 22 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
1 23 positions:  
1 24 ..... \$ 19,049,509  
1 25 ..... FTEs 445.00  
1 26 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS == ANIMAL HUSBANDRY  
1 27 Sec. 2. GENERAL FUND == CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE CONTROL  
1 28 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
1 29 state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship  
1 30 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June  
1 31 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
1 32 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:  
1 33 For purposes of administering a chronic wasting disease  
1 34 control program for the control of chronic wasting disease  
1 35 which threatens farm deer as provided in chapter 170,  
2 1 including for salaries, support, maintenance, and  
2 2 miscellaneous purposes:  
2 3 ..... \$ 100,000  
2 4 The program may include procedures for the inspection and  
2 5 testing of farm deer, responses to reported cases of chronic  
2 6 wasting disease, and methods to ensure that owners of farm  
2 7 deer may engage in the movement and sale of farm deer.  
2 8 Sec. 3. HORSE AND DOG RACING. There is appropriated from  
2 9 the moneys available under section 99D.13 to the department of  
2 10 agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning  
2 11 July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount,  
2 12 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
2 13 purposes designated:  
2 14 For purposes of supporting the department's administration  
2 15 and enforcement of horse and dog racing law pursuant to  
2 16 section 99D.22, including for salaries, support, maintenance,  
2 17 and miscellaneous purposes:  
2 18 ..... \$ 305,516  
2 19 Sec. 4. GENERAL FUND == DAIRY PRODUCTS CONTROL. There is  
2 20 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
2 21 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal  
2 22 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
2 23 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
2 24 used for the purposes designated:  
2 25 For purposes of supporting the operations of the dairy  
2 26 products control bureau, including for salaries, support,  
2 27 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:  
2 28 ..... \$ 950,000  
2 29 Sec. 5. GENERAL FUND == AVIAN INFLUENZA CONTROL. There is  
2 30 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
2 31 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal  
2 32 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
2 33 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
2 34 used for the purpose designated:  
2 35 For purposes of controlling avian influenza by conducting  
3 1 testing and monitoring:  
3 2 ..... \$ 50,000  
3 3 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this

3 4 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close  
3 5 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available  
3 6 to be used for the continued testing and monitoring of avian  
3 7 influenza.

3 8 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS == PLANT PROTECTION AND  
3 9 CROP PRODUCTION

3 10 Sec. 6. GENERAL FUND == APIARY LAW. There is appropriated  
3 11 from the general fund of the state to the department of  
3 12 agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning  
3 13 July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount,  
3 14 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
3 15 purposes designated:

3 16 For purposes of administering and enforcing apiary law as  
3 17 provided in chapter 160, including for salaries, support,  
3 18 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

3 19 ..... \$ 75,000

3 20 Sec. 7. GYPSY MOTH CONTROL. There is appropriated from  
3 21 the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture  
3 22 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
3 23 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount, or so  
3 24 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
3 25 designated:

3 26 For the control of the pest commonly referred to as the  
3 27 gypsy moth, including but not limited to the detection,  
3 28 surveillance, and eradication of the gypsy moth:

3 29 ..... \$ 50,000

3 30 Sec. 8. EMERALD ASH BORER PUBLIC AWARENESS PROJECT. There  
3 31 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
3 32 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal  
3 33 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
3 34 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
3 35 used for the purposes designated:

4 1 For the support of a public awareness project to inform  
4 2 persons regarding the presence and danger of the pest commonly  
4 3 known as the emerald ash borer:

4 4 ..... \$ 50,000

4 5 Sec. 9. GENERAL FUND == SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION  
4 6 DISTRICTS. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
4 7 state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship  
4 8 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June  
4 9 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
4 10 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

4 11 For purposes of reimbursing commissioners of soil and water  
4 12 conservation districts for administrative expenses including  
4 13 but not limited to travel expenses, technical training, and  
4 14 professional dues:

4 15 ..... \$ 400,000

4 16 A soil and water conservation district receiving moneys  
4 17 from an allocation provided pursuant to this section shall  
4 18 submit a report to the soil conservation division of the  
4 19 department of agriculture and land stewardship by July 1,  
4 20 2009, accounting for moneys which have been expended or  
4 21 unexpended or which have been obligated or encumbered. The  
4 22 report shall state how the moneys were used.

4 23 Sec. 10. AGRICHEMICAL REMEDIATION FUND == SOIL AND WATER  
4 24 CONSERVATION NEEDS ASSESSMENT ASSOCIATED WITH THE LITTLE SIOUX  
4 25 RIVER. There is appropriated from the agrichemical  
4 26 remediation fund created in section 161.7 to the department of  
4 27 agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning  
4 28 July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount,  
4 29 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
4 30 purposes designated:

4 31 For a grant to the governing body of a soil and water  
4 32 conservation district of a county bordering the Missouri river  
4 33 through which the Little Sioux and Big Sioux rivers flow for  
4 34 purposes of supporting a needs assessment of soil and water  
4 35 conservation structures associated with the Little Sioux  
5 1 river, which may include the identification and evaluation of  
5 2 aging and deteriorating soil and water conservation structures  
5 3 subject to major renovation in the watershed:

5 6 Sec. 11. GENERAL FUND == SENIOR FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION  
5 7 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
5 8 state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship  
5 9 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June  
5 10 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
5 11 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

5 12 For purposes of administering a senior farmers' market  
5 13 nutrition program, including salaries, support, maintenance,  
5 14 and miscellaneous purposes:

5 15 ..... \$ 75,000  
5 16 Sec. 12. EMERGENCY VETERINARIAN RAPID RESPONSE SERVICES  
5 17 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
5 18 state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship  
5 19 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June  
5 20 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
5 21 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:  
5 22 For purposes of supporting veterinary emergency  
5 23 preparedness and response services necessary to prevent or  
5 24 control a serious threat to the public health, public safety,  
5 25 or the state's economy caused by the transmission of disease  
5 26 among livestock or agricultural animals, including as provided  
5 27 in section 163.3A:  
5 28 ..... \$ 130,000  
5 29 Sec. 13. ORGANIC AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS. There is  
5 30 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
5 31 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal  
5 32 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
5 33 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
5 34 used for the purposes designated:  
5 35 For purposes of supporting the department's regulation and  
6 1 promotion of organic agricultural products as provided in  
6 2 chapter 190C, including salaries, support, maintenance,  
6 3 miscellaneous purposes:  
6 4 ..... \$ 50,000  
6 5 Sec. 14. FARM=TO=SCHOOL PROGRAM. There is appropriated  
6 6 from the general fund of the state to the department of  
6 7 agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning  
6 8 July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount,  
6 9 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
6 10 purposes designated:  
6 11 For purposes of supporting the farm=to=school program  
6 12 created in chapter 190A to encourage and promote the purchase  
6 13 of locally and regionally produced or processed food in order  
6 14 to improve child nutrition and strengthen local and regional  
6 15 farm economies:  
6 16 ..... \$ 80,000  
6 17 Sec. 15. GRAPE AND WINE DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is  
6 18 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the grape  
6 19 and wine development fund created in section 175A.5 for the  
6 20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009,  
6 21 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to  
6 22 be used for the purposes designated:  
6 23 For carrying out the purposes of the fund:  
6 24 ..... \$ 280,000  
6 25 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS == MOTOR FUEL  
6 26 Sec. 16. MOTOR FUEL INSPECTION. There is appropriated  
6 27 from the renewable fuel infrastructure fund created in section  
6 28 15G.205 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship  
6 29 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June  
6 30 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
6 31 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:  
6 32 For purposes of the inspection of motor fuel, including  
6 33 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:  
6 34 ..... \$ 300,000  
6 35 The department shall establish and administer programs for  
7 1 the auditing of motor fuel including biofuel processing and  
7 2 production plants, for screening and testing motor fuel,  
7 3 including renewable fuel, and for the inspection of motor fuel  
7 4 sold by dealers including retail dealers who sell and dispense  
7 5 motor fuel from motor fuel pumps.

7 7 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES  
7 8 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS  
7 9 Sec. 17. GENERAL FUND == DEPARTMENT. There is  
7 10 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
7 11 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning  
7 12 July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount,  
7 13 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
7 14 purposes designated:  
7 15 For purposes of supporting the department, including its  
7 16 divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for  
7 17 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes;  
7 18 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
7 19 positions:  
7 20 ..... \$ 19,994,822  
7 21 ..... FTEs 1,169.95  
7 22 Sec. 18. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND == DIVISION  
7 23 OF FISH AND WILDLIFE.  
7 24 1. a. There is appropriated from the state fish and game  
7 25 protection fund to the department of natural resources for the

7 26 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009,  
7 27 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to  
7 28 be used for the purposes designated:  
7 29 For purposes of supporting the division of fish and  
7 30 wildlife, including for administration, regulation, and  
7 31 programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,  
7 32 and miscellaneous purposes:

7 33 ..... \$ 37,626,733

7 34 b. Notwithstanding section 455A.10, the department may use  
7 35 the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish and  
8 1 game protection fund to provide for the funding of health and  
8 2 life insurance premium payments from unused sick leave  
8 3 balances of conservation peace officers employed in a  
8 4 protection occupation who retire, pursuant to section 97B.49B.

8 5 2. The department shall not expend more moneys from the  
8 6 state fish and game protection fund than provided in this  
8 7 section, unless the expenditure derives from contributions  
8 8 made by a private entity, or a grant or moneys received from  
8 9 the federal government, and is approved by the natural  
8 10 resource commission. The department of natural resources  
8 11 shall promptly notify the legislative services agency and the  
8 12 chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations  
8 13 subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources concerning  
8 14 the commission's approval.

8 20 allocated pursuant to that section, the following amount, or  
8 21 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
8 22 designated:

8 23 For purposes of supporting the department's protection of  
8 24 the state's groundwater, including for administration,  
8 25 regulation, and programs, and for salaries, support,  
8 26 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:

8 27 ..... \$ 3,455,832

8 28 Sec. 20. NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM

8 29 PERMIT FUND. There is appropriated from the national  
8 30 pollutant discharge elimination system permit fund created in  
8 31 section 455B.196 to the department of natural resources for  
8 32 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30,  
8 33 2009, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
8 34 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

8 35 For purposes of expediting the department's processing of  
9 1 national pollutant discharge elimination system applications  
9 2 and the issuance of permits, including salaries, support,  
9 3 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

9 4 ..... \$ 700,000

9 5 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS == MISCELLANEOUS

9 6 Sec. 21. SPECIAL SNOWMOBILE FUND == SNOWMOBILE PROGRAM.

9 7 There is transferred on July 1, 2008, from the fees required  
9 8 to be deposited in the special snowmobile fund under section  
9 9 321G.7 to the fish and game protection fund and appropriated  
9 10 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year  
9 11 beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
9 12 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
9 13 used for the purpose designated:

9 14 For purposes of administering and enforcing the state

9 17 Sec. 22. UNASSIGNED REVENUE FUND == UNDERGROUND STORAGE

9 18 TANK SECTION EXPENSES. There is appropriated from the  
9 19 unassigned revenue fund administered by the Iowa comprehensive  
9 20 underground storage tank fund board to the department of  
9 21 natural resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008,  
9 22 and ending June 30, 2009, the following amount, or so much  
9 23 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose  
9 24 designated:

9 25 For purposes of paying for administration expenses of the

10 15 ending June 30, 2009, the department of natural resources may  
10 16 use additional moneys available to the department collected  
10 17 from storm water discharge permit fees as provided in section  
10 18 455B.103A or 455B.197 for the staffing of the following  
10 19 additional full-time equivalent positions for the purposes  
10 20 designated:

10 29 Sec. 25. AGRICHEMICAL REMEDIATION FUND == OPEN FEEDLOT  
10 30 WATER QUALITY RESEARCH PROJECT. There is appropriated from  
10 31 the agrichemical remediation fund created in section 161.7 to  
10 32 Iowa state university of science and technology for the fiscal  
10 33 year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30, 2009, the  
10 34 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
10 35 used for the purposes designated:

11 1 For purposes of supporting a water quality research project  
11 2 which studies the effectiveness of alternative technologies  
11 3 used to reduce risks to water quality from effluent  
11 4 originating from open feedlots which house beef cattle:  
11 5 ..... \$ 50,000

11 6 In conducting the project, Iowa state university of science  
11 7 and technology shall cooperate with the Iowa cattlemen's

11 19 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic  
11 20 laboratory and for not more than the following full-time  
11 21 equivalent positions:

11 23 ..... FTEs 17.79

11 24 2. Iowa state university of science and technology shall  
11 25 not reduce the amount that it allocates to support the college  
11 26 of veterinary medicine from any other source due to the  
11 27 appropriation made in this section.

11 28 3. If by the end of the fiscal year, Iowa state university  
11 29 of science and technology fails to allocate the moneys  
11 30 appropriated in this section to the college of veterinary  
11 31 medicine in accordance with this section, the moneys  
11 32 appropriated in this section for that fiscal year shall revert  
11 33 to the general fund of the state.

11 34 Sec. 27. VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY == FUTURE YEAR.  
11 35 It is the intent of the general assembly that a future general  
12 1 assembly appropriate moneys to Iowa state university of  
12 2 science and technology for the designated fiscal year, or so  
12 3 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
12 4 designated:

12 9 DIVISION IV  
12 10 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND == GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

12 11 Sec. 28. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP.  
12 12 There is appropriated from the environment first fund created

12 13 in section 8.57A to the department of agriculture and land  
12 14 stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and  
12 15 ending June 30, 2009, the following amounts, or so much  
12 16 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
12 17 designated:

12 18 1. CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)  
12 19 a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to  
12 20 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of  
12 21 intercepting tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss,  
12 22 improving water quality, and enhancing agricultural production  
12 23 practices:  
12 24 ..... \$ 1,500,000  
12 25 b. Not more than 8 percent of the moneys appropriated in

13 2 a. For continuation of a statewide voluntary farm  
13 3 management demonstration program to demonstrate the  
13 4 effectiveness and adaptability of emerging practices in  
13 5 agronomy that protect water resources and provide other  
13 6 environmental benefits:
