SENATE FILE 2286

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS AND OTHER FEDERAL GRANTS, ALLOCATING PORTIONS OF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS, AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED OR IF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the following amount:

..... \$ 13,474,900

a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, subc. XVII, part B, subpart ii, which provides for the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for administrative expenses.

c. The department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, for pregnant women and women with dependent children.

d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

2. At least 20 percent of the funds remaining from the appropriation made in subsection 1 shall be allocated for prevention programs.

3. In implementing the federal substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, subc. XVII, and any other applicable provisions of the federal Public Health Service Act under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, the department shall apply the provisions of Pub. L. No. 106-310, } 3305, as codified in 42 U.S.C. } 300x=65, relating to services under such federal law being provided by religious and other nongovernmental organizations.

Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the following amount:

..... \$ 3,631,173

b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, subc. XVII, part B, subpart i, which provides for the community mental health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

c. The department shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community mental health services providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved by the federal substance abuse and mental health services administration for the fiscal year involved.

d. Of the amount allocated to eligible services providers under paragraph "c", 70 percent shall be distributed to the state's accredited community mental health centers established or designated by counties in accordance with law or administrative rule. If a county has not established or designated a community mental health center and has received a waiver from the mental health, mental retardation, developmental disabilities, and brain injury commission, the mental health services provider designated by that county is

3 4 eligible to receive funding distributed pursuant to this  
3 5 paragraph in lieu of a community mental health center. The  
3 6 funding distributed shall be used by recipients of the funding  
3 7 for the purpose of developing and providing evidence-based  
3 8 practices and emergency services to adults with a serious  
3 9 mental illness and children with a serious emotional  
3 10 disturbance. The distribution amounts shall be announced at  
3 11 the beginning of the federal fiscal year and distributed on a  
3 12 quarterly basis according to the formulas used in previous  
3 13 fiscal years. Recipients shall submit quarterly reports  
3 14 containing data consistent with the performance measures  
3 15 approved by the federal substance abuse and mental health  
3 16 services administration.

3 17 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds  
3 18 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department  
3 19 of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds  
3 20 set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the  
3 21 department shall pay to the auditor of state an amount  
3 22 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and  
3 23 administration of the state's portion of the funds  
3 24 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill  
3 25 the department for the costs of the audits.

3 26 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

3 27 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
3 28 8.41 to the department of public health for the federal fiscal  
3 29 year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009,  
3 30 the following amount:

3 31 ..... \$ 6,579,555

3 32 a. The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
3 33 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
3 34 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 7, subc.  
3 35 V, which provides for the maternal and child health services  
4 1 block grant. The department shall expend the funds  
4 2 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law  
4 3 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter  
4 4 17A.

4 5 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used  
4 6 by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect  
4 7 costs.

4 8 2. An amount not exceeding 10 percent of the funds  
4 9 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department  
4 10 of public health for administrative expenses.

4 11 3. The departments of public health, human services, and  
4 12 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional  
4 13 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the  
4 14 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of  
4 15 services to women and children.

4 16 4. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds  
4 17 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement  
4 18 appropriations for maternal and child health programs within  
4 19 the department of public health. Of these funds, \$300,291  
4 20 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care program.

4 21 b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds  
4 22 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the  
4 23 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of  
4 24 the state board of regents for mobile and regional child  
4 25 health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals  
4 26 and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs  
4 27 from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to  
4 28 establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile  
4 29 and regional child health specialty clinics.

4 30 5. The department of public health shall administer the  
4 31 statewide maternal and child health program and the disabled  
4 32 children's program by conducting mobile and regional child  
4 33 health specialty clinics and conducting other activities to  
4 34 improve the health of low-income women and children and to  
4 35 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential  
5 1 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance  
5 2 with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social  
5 3 Security Act.

5 4 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES  
5 5 APPROPRIATIONS.

5 6 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
5 7 8.41 to the department of public health for the federal fiscal  
5 8 year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009,  
5 9 the following amount:

5 10 ..... \$ 1,084,524

5 11 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
5 12 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
5 13 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, subc.  
5 14 XVII, part A, which provides for the preventive health and

5 15 health services block grant. The department shall expend the  
5 16 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the  
5 17 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with  
5 18 chapter 17A.

5 19 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, an amount  
5 20 not more than 10 percent shall be used by the department for  
5 21 administrative expenses.

5 22 3. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific  
5 23 amount of funds stipulated by the notice of the block grant  
5 24 award shall be allocated for services to victims of sex  
5 25 offenses and for rape prevention education.

5 26 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 2  
5 27 and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 may be  
5 28 used by the department for healthy people 2010/healthy Iowans  
5 29 2010 program objectives, preventive health advisory committee,  
5 30 and risk reduction services, including nutrition programs,  
5 31 health incentive programs, chronic disease services, emergency  
5 32 medical services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and  
5 33 start-up fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency  
5 34 syndrome services. The moneys specified in this subsection  
5 35 shall not be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and  
6 1 clinics or by the state hygienic laboratory for the funding of  
6 2 indirect costs.

6 3 Sec. 5. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM  
6 4 APPROPRIATION.

6 5 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
6 6 8.41 to the department of justice for the federal fiscal year  
6 7 beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the  
6 8 following amount:

6 9 ..... \$ 1,312,647

6 10 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated  
6 11 funds to be received from the federal government for the  
6 12 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46, } 3796gg=1,  
6 13 which provides for grants to combat violent crimes against  
6 14 women. The department of justice shall expend the funds  
6 15 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law  
6 16 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter  
6 17 17A.

6 18 2. An amount not exceeding 10 percent of the funds  
6 19 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department  
6 20 of justice for administrative expenses. From the funds set  
6 21 aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the  
6 22 department shall pay to the auditor of state an amount  
6 23 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and  
6 24 administration of the state's portion of the funds  
6 25 appropriated in subsection 1.

6 26 Sec. 6. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE  
6 27 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from  
6 28 the fund created by section 8.41 to the office of the governor  
6 29 for the drug policy coordinator for the federal fiscal year  
6 30 beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the  
6 31 following amount:

6 32 ..... \$ 74,993

6 33 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds  
6 34 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
6 35 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46, subc. XII=G,  
7 1 which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs  
7 2 in state and local correctional facilities. The drug policy  
7 3 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this  
7 4 section as provided in federal law making the funds available  
7 5 and in conformance with chapter 17A.

7 6 Sec. 7. EDWARD BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM  
7 7 APPROPRIATION.

7 8 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
7 9 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug policy  
7 10 coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,  
7 11 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the following amount:

7 12 ..... \$ 880,209

7 13 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated  
7 14 funds to be received from the federal government for the  
7 15 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46, subc. V, which  
7 16 provides for the Edward Byrne memorial justice assistance  
7 17 grant program. The drug policy coordinator shall expend the  
7 18 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the  
7 19 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with  
7 20 chapter 17A.

7 21 2. An amount not exceeding 10 percent of the funds  
7 22 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug policy  
7 23 coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set  
7 24 aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug  
7 25 policy coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount

7 26 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and  
7 27 administration of the state's portion of the funds  
7 28 appropriated in subsection 1.  
7 29 Sec. 8. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.  
7 30 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by  
7 31 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of  
7 32 the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year  
7 33 beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the  
7 34 following amount:

7 35 ..... \$ 7,040,675

8 1 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
8 2 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
8 3 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 106, which  
8 4 provides for the community services block grant. The division  
8 5 of community action agencies of the department of human rights  
8 6 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as  
8 7 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in  
8 8 conformance with chapter 17A.

8 9 b. The administrator of the division of community action  
8 10 agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not  
8 11 less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to  
8 12 eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting  
8 13 low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a  
8 14 minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum  
8 15 allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds  
8 16 from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds.  
8 17 The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty=  
8 18 level population in the area represented by the community  
8 19 action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level  
8 20 population in the state.

8 21 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds  
8 22 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of  
8 23 community action agencies of the department of human rights  
8 24 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this  
8 25 subsection for administrative expenses, the division of  
8 26 community action agencies of the department of human rights  
8 27 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay  
8 28 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's  
8 29 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The  
8 30 auditor of state shall bill the division of community action  
8 31 agencies for the costs of the audits.

8 32 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

8 33 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
8 34 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal  
8 35 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September  
9 1 30, 2009, the following amount:

9 2 ..... \$ 25,642,000

9 3 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
9 4 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
9 5 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 69, which  
9 6 provides for community development block grants. The  
9 7 department of economic development shall expend the funds  
9 8 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law  
9 9 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter  
9 10 17A.

9 11 2. An amount not exceeding \$1,125,680 for the federal  
9 12 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, shall be used by the  
9 13 department of economic development for administrative expenses  
9 14 for the community development block grant. The total amount  
9 15 used for administrative expenses includes \$612,840 for the  
9 16 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, of funds  
9 17 appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from  
9 18 the state equal to \$512,840 from the appropriation of state  
9 19 funds for the community development block grant and state  
9 20 appropriations for related activities of the department of  
9 21 economic development. From the funds set aside for  
9 22 administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of  
9 23 economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an  
9 24 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and  
9 25 administration of the state's portion of the funds  
9 26 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill  
9 27 the department for the costs of the audit.

9 28 Sec. 10. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

9 29 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
9 30 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the  
9 31 department of human rights for the federal fiscal year  
9 32 beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the  
9 33 following amount:

9 34 ..... \$ 36,343,186

9 35 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
10 1 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the

10 2 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 94, subc.  
10 3 II, which provides for the low-income home energy assistance  
10 4 block grants. The division of community action agencies of  
10 5 the department of human rights shall expend the funds  
10 6 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law  
10 7 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter  
10 8 17A.

10 9 2. Up to 15 percent of the amount appropriated in this  
10 10 section that is actually received shall be used for  
10 11 residential weatherization or other related home repairs for  
10 12 low-income households. Of this allocation amount, not more  
10 13 than 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

10 14 3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2, up to  
10 15 10 percent of the remainder is allocated for administrative  
10 16 expenses of the low-income home energy assistance program of  
10 17 which \$377,000 is allocated for administrative expenses of the  
10 18 division. The costs of auditing the use and administration of  
10 19 the portion of the appropriation in this section that is  
10 20 retained by the state shall be paid from the amount allocated  
10 21 in this subsection to the division. The auditor of state  
10 22 shall bill the division for the audit costs.

10 23 4. The remainder of the appropriation in this section  
10 24 following the allocations made in subsections 2 and 3, shall  
10 25 be used to help eligible households as defined in 42 U.S.C.,  
10 26 ch. 94, subc. II, to meet home energy costs.

10 27 5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in  
10 28 this section that is actually received may be carried forward  
10 29 for use in the succeeding federal fiscal year.

10 30 6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy  
10 31 problems shall be limited to 5 percent of the amount  
10 32 appropriated in this section that is actually received.

10 33 Sec. 11. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

10 34 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section  
10 35 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal  
11 1 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September  
11 2 30, 2009, the following amount:

11 3 ..... \$ 16,832,721

11 4 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds  
11 5 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the  
11 6 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., ch. 7, subc.  
11 7 XX, which provides for the social services block grant. The  
11 8 department of human services shall expend the funds  
11 9 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law  
11 10 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter  
11 11 17A.

11 12 2. Not more than \$1,074,798 of the funds appropriated in  
11 13 subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services  
11 14 for general administration. From the funds set aside in this  
11 15 subsection for general administration, the department of human  
11 16 services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount  
11 17 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and  
11 18 administration of the state's portion of the funds  
11 19 appropriated in subsection 1.

11 20 3. In addition to the allocation for general  
11 21 administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds  
11 22 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the  
11 23 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal  
11 24 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, for the following  
11 25 programs within the department of human services:

11 26 a. Field operations:

11 27 ..... \$ 6,428,488

11 28 b. Child and family services:

11 29 ..... \$ 963,200

11 30 c. Local administrative costs and other local services:

11 31 ..... \$ 681,759

11 32 d. Volunteers:

11 33 ..... \$ 74,640

11 34 e. MH/MR/DD/BI community services (local purchase):

11 35 ..... \$ 7,609,836

12 1 Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department  
12 2 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop  
12 3 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant  
12 4 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

12 5 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services  
12 6 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with  
12 7 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify  
12 8 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to  
12 9 fund the state programs and services.

12 10 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and  
12 11 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social  
12 12 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social

12 13 services block grant funds available for the local programs  
12 14 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal  
12 15 social services block grant funds to the counties. The  
12 16 proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will  
12 17 be used to fund the local programs and services.

12 18 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's  
12 19 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

12 20 Sec. 13. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM  
12 21 HOMELESSNESS.

12 22 1. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from the  
12 23 federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health administration  
12 24 to provide mental health services for the homeless, for the  
12 25 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending  
12 26 September 30, 2009, the department of human services shall  
12 27 assure that a project which receives funds under the formula  
12 28 grant from either the federal or local match share of 25  
12 29 percent in order to provide outreach services to persons who  
12 30 have chronic mental illness and are homeless or who are  
12 31 subject to a significant probability of becoming homeless  
12 32 shall do all of the following:

12 33 a. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic  
12 34 services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and  
12 35 rehabilitation services.

13 1 b. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary  
13 2 hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health  
13 3 services and substance abuse services.

13 4 c. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide  
13 5 services to persons targeted by the grant.

13 6 d. Provide case management to homeless persons.

13 7 e. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain  
13 8 homeless persons living in residential settings which are not  
13 9 otherwise supported.

13 10 2. Projects may expend funds for housing services  
13 11 including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing,  
13 12 security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance  
13 13 in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing  
13 14 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless  
13 15 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental  
13 16 payments to prevent eviction.

13 17 Sec. 14. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATION. There  
13 18 is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the  
13 19 department of human services for the federal fiscal year  
13 20 beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009, the  
13 21 following amount:

13 22 ..... \$ 41,212,320

13 23 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds  
13 24 anticipated to be received from the federal government under  
13 25 42 U.S.C., ch. 105, subc. II=B, which provides for the child  
13 26 care and development block grant. The department shall expend  
13 27 the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the  
13 28 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with  
13 29 chapter 17A.

13 30 Moneys appropriated in this section that remain  
13 31 unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year  
13 32 shall revert to be available for appropriation for purposes of  
13 33 the child care and development block grant in the succeeding  
13 34 fiscal year.

13 35 Sec. 15. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

14 1 1. If the funds received from the federal government for  
14 2 the block grants specified in this Act are less than the  
14 3 amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be  
14 4 prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than  
14 5 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape  
14 6 prevention education under section 4, subsection 3, of this  
14 7 Act, for which each block grant is available according to the  
14 8 percentages that each program is to receive as specified in  
14 9 this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds  
14 10 allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to  
14 11 accomplish the purposes of a particular program, or if the  
14 12 appropriation is not allocated by percentage, the governor may  
14 13 allocate the funds in a manner which will accomplish to the  
14 14 greatest extent possible the purposes of the various programs  
14 15 for which the block grants are available.

14 16 2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for  
14 17 in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

14 18 a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and  
14 19 house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate  
14 20 chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those  
14 21 committees, and the director of the legislative services  
14 22 agency shall be notified of the proposed action.

14 23 b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and

14 24 information on the reasons why particular percentages or  
14 25 amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the  
14 26 departments and programs affected, and other information  
14 27 deemed useful. Chairpersons and ranking members notified  
14 28 shall be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on  
14 29 the proposed action before the action is taken.
