AN ACT


PROVIDING AN EXCESS WEIGHT ALLOWANCE FOR SPECIAL TRUCKS
HAULING DISTILLERS GRAINS.


BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.466, subsection 5, Code 2009, is amended to read as follows:

5. ~~It shall be unlawful for any person to~~ A person shall ~~not~~ operate a motor truck, trailer, truck tractor, road tractor, semitrailer, or combination thereof, or any such vehicle equipped with a transferable auxiliary axle or axles, on the public highways with a gross weight exceeding ~~that the~~ gross weight for which it is registered by more than five percent ~~of the gross weight for which it is registered,~~ provided, however, that any vehicle or vehicle combination referred to ~~herein~~ in this subsection, while carrying a load of raw farm products, soil fertilizers, including ground limestone, raw dairy products, ~~or~~ livestock, live poultry, or eggs, or a special truck, while carrying a load of distillers


grains, may be operated with a gross weight of twenty-five percent in excess of the gross weight for which it is registered.
