A BILL FOR

An Act to appropriate from the general fund of the state of Iowa to the state board of regents for capital improvements, repairs, replacements, alterations and equipment.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general
- 2 fund of the state of Iowa to the state board of regents for
- 3 capital improvements, repairs, replacements, alterations and
- 4 equipment, the sum of twenty million seven hundred eighty-nine
- 5 thousand two hundred dollars (\$20,789,200.00), the same being
- 6 allotted to the various institutions under the state board of
- 7 regents in the following amounts:

21 (In the event the board of
22 regents, with the approval of
23 the Budget and Financial
24 Control Committee, finds
25 that a general classroom and
26 educational building is not
27 as practicable and economical

30 hereinafter specified, then
31 such buildings are authorized
32 and the amounts set out there-
33 for are hereby appropriated;
34 provided, however, that two
35 or more of such buildings may
36 be combined into a general
37 classroom and educational
38 building and the remainder of
39 such buildings may be built
40 separately, with the approval
41 of the Budget and Financial
42 Control Committee.)

1 Sec. 2. Such sums for each institution shall be
 2 expended in accordance with the above list of priorities in the
 3 approximate estimated amounts. Such amounts and order of
 4 priority may be changed by the state board of regents with
 5 the approval of the budget and financial control committee.

1 Sec. 3. Preliminary plans, or descriptions, and a project
 2 estimate for improvements for which funds are hereinabove
 3 appropriated shall be submitted by the state board of regents

4 to the budget and financial control committee for approval
5 before bids on the improvements are requested. Contracts for
6 construction of improvements for which funds are hereinabove
7 appropriated and project budgets shall be submitted by the
8 state board of regents to the budget and financial control
9 committee for approval after bids are received. Items commonly
10 known as change orders need not be submitted to the budget and
11 financial control committee for approval unless such change
12 orders actually increase the total cost of that particular
13 contract by three per cent (3%) or more.

1 Sec. 4. The state board of regents and the budget and
2 financial control committee are hereby authorized to accept
3 federal grants to the state to be used in connection with the
4 funds hereinabove appropriated.

1 Sec. 5. Upon the completion of the contract documents
2 and the determination of the total cost of any projects as set
3 forth in this Act, any unobligated balance remaining may be
4 used for any repairs as needed at the respective institution
5 and to supplement at such institution any current or prior
6 appropriations for buildings, repairs, improvements, replace-
7 ments, alterations, and equipment.

1 Sec. 6. Before any of the funds hereinabove appropriated
2 shall be expended, it shall be determined by the state board of
3 regents, with the approval of the budget and financial control
4 committee, that the expenditure shall be for the best interests
5 of the state.

1 Sec. 7. In the event that H. R. 6483, providing for federal
2 grants and loans for construction of academic buildings and for
3 scholarships, as filed in the House of Representatives of the

4 Congress of the United States, or other federal legislation for
 5 the same general purposes, should become law and require that an
 6 agency of the State be created or designated for the administra-
 7 tion of the law as it may apply and be to the benefit of all
 8 public and private institutions of higher education in the State
 9 of Iowa, the Governor of the State of Iowa is hereby empowered
 10 to appoint or designate an agency broadly representative of all
 11 higher education and the public of Iowa as a State Commission on
 12 Academic Facilities and Scholarships.

1 Sec. 8. This Act being deemed of immediate importance shall
 2 be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
 3 publication in The Montezuma Republican, a newspaper published
 4 in Montezuma, Iowa, and The Seymour Herald, a newspaper
 5 published in Seymour, Iowa.

 HOUSE FILE 709

1 Amend House File 709 by substituting for section 2 the
 2 following:
 3 "Sec. 2. Such sums for each institution shall be expended in
 4 accordance with the above list of priorities in the approximate
 5 estimated amounts, except that the portion of the funds
 6 appropriated under section 1, item 3 for the State University
 7 of Iowa for the construction of a water treatment plant, and
 8 such additional capital funds as may be needed and subsequently
 9 appropriated for this purpose, may be used in cooperation with
 10 the City of Iowa City to acquire, own, construct, establish,
 11 purchase, maintain and/or alter a water treatment plant for
 12 service to the city, community and the university under such
 13 terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed to by the board
 14 of regents and the City of Iowa City and approved by the budget
 15 and financial control committee. Such water treatment plant
 16 shall serve the university as a customer and the university
 17 shall have power to participate in the operation and maintenance
 18 of such water treatment plant and to allocate from operating
 19 funds for the operation and maintenance and service to the
 20 university under such conditions and terms as may be mutually
 21 agreed to by the board of regents and the City of Iowa City.
 22 Such amounts and order of priority may be changed by the state
 23 board of regents with the approval of the budget and financial
 24 control committee.
