A BILL FOR

An Act to amend section one hundred seventy-six A point ten (176A.10), Code 1958, relating to county agricultural extension education tax.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section one hundred seventy-six A point ten
2 (176A.10), Code 1958, is hereby amended by striking all of
3 the section following the "colon (:)" in line eleven (11)
4 thereof, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
5 "For the 'county agricultural extension education fund'
6 annually not to exceed one-half (1/2) mill on the dollar of
7 assessed valuation, provided, however, that no extension
8 council in an extension district shall make an estimate or
9 certify an amount in any one year in excess of thirty thousand
10 (30,000) dollars in districts having a population of sixty
11 thousand (60,000 or more, and not in excess of twenty-five
12 thousand (25,000) dollars in all extension districts having a
13 population of less than sixty thousand (60,000), which shall be
14 the maximum amount that any such extension district shall be
15 entitled to receive annually from the county. The extension
16 council in every extension district shall in every respect
17 comply with chapter twenty-four (24), Code 1958."

 2 Chapter one hundred seventy-six A (176A), Code 1958, is
 3 amended by adding thereto the following section:
 4 "Any two or more extension districts may be consolidated to
 5 form a single extension district, by resolution duly adopted by
 6 the extension council of each such extension district. Upon
 7 adoption of such resolutions providing for such consolidation, the
 8 extension councils shall do all things which may be necessary or
 9 convenient to carry into effect such consolidation. The initial
 10 extension council for such new extension district shall consist of
 11 the members of the extension councils of the consolidated extension
 12 districts. The extension council of such new extension district
 13 shall promptly elect officers as provided in this chapter, and upon
 14 such election the terms of the officers of the extension councils
 15 of the consolidated extension districts shall terminate. The
 16 extension council of the new extension district shall select a
 17 name for such district and shall file the name, together with
 18 copies of the resolutions providing for such consolidation, with
 19 the recorder of each county affected thereby. The new extension
 20 district shall be regarded for all purposes as an extension dis-
 21 trict, the same as if such extension district consisted of a
 22 single county, and its extension council and officers thereof
 23 shall have all the powers and duties which now or hereafter may
 24 pertain to extension councils and officers thereof. All assets
 25 and liabilities of the consolidated extension districts shall
 26 become the assets and liabilities of the new extension district.
 27 The millage rate for the "county agricultural extension education
 28 fund" shall be the same in each county included in an extension dis-
 29 trict formed by consolidation. For the purposes of any law requiring
 30 extension districts to file any document with or certify
 31 any information to any county officer or board, an extension
 32 district formed by consolidation shall file or certify the
 33 same with or to the appropriate officer or board of each
 34 county included in the extension district. An extension
 35 district formed by consolidation may be dissolved and the
 36 original extension districts as they existed prior to such
 37 consolidation may be re-established, by resolution duly
 38 adopted by the extension council of such extension district;
 39 and upon adoption of such resolution, the extension council
 40 shall do all things which may be necessary or convenient to
 41 carry into effect such dissolution and the re-establishment
 42 of the original extension districts.
