Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Section four hundred seventy-one point four
- 2 (471.4), Code 1958, is hereby amended by adding after the word
- 3 "highways" in lines four (4) and five (5) of subsection one (1)
- 4 the following:
- 5 " , and for the carrying out of plans for the acquisition of
- 6 land advanced by a county conservation board, and approved by
- 7 the state conservation commission as provided in section one
- 8 hundred eleven A point four (111A.4)."
