A BILL FOR

An Act to prohibit use of artificial lights for hunting.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Chapter one hundred nine (109), Code 1958, is
 2 hereby amended by adding the following new section:
 3 "It shall be unlawful to throw or cast the rays of a
 4 spotlight, headlight or other artificial light on any highway,
 5 or in any field, woodland or forest for the purpose of spotting,
 6 locating or taking or attempting to take or hunt any animal,
 7 except racoons when treed with the aid of dogs, while having
 8 in possession or control, either singly or as one of a group of
 9 persons, any firearm, bow or other implement except as permitted
 10 by law whereby game could be killed.
 11 "Any person violating this section shall be punished by a
 12 fine of not more than three hundred dollars or imprisonment in
 13 the county jail for a period not to exceed thirty days."
