A BILL FOR

An Act to amend chapter four hundred eleven (411), Code 1958,
relating to retirement systems for policemen and firemen.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Section four hundred eleven point six (411.6),
- 2 subsection nine (9), Code 1958, is hereby amended as follows:
- 3 1. By inserting after the word "member" in line three (3)
- 4 the words "in service or the chief of police or fire departments".
- 5 2. By striking from lines four (4), five (5), six (6) and
- 6 seven (7) the words "accident or exposure occurring at some
- 7 definite time and place while the member was in the actual
- 8 performance of duty, or occurring" and inserting in lieu thereof
- 9 the words "injury or disease incurred in or aggravated by the
- 10 actual performance of duty at some definite time and place, or".
- 11 3. By striking the colon in line seventeen (17) following
- 12 the word "trustees" and inserting in lieu thereof the words
- 13 "the benefits set forth in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this
- 14 subsection:".
- 15 4. By adding to said subsection the following paragraph:
- 16 "Disease under this subsection shall mean heart disease or
- 17 any disease of the lungs or respiratory tract and shall be
- 18 presumed to have been contracted while on active duty as a
- 19 result of strain or the inhalation of noxious fumes, poison,
- 20 or gases."

EXPLANATION OF SENATE FILE 485

The intent of this bill is to bring the accidental death section of chapter 411, Code 1958, in line with the accidental disability section as amended by chapter 292, Acts of the 58th General Assembly. (Known as Senate File 264 by committee on cities and towns, which passed the General Assembly unanimously.)
