A BILL FOR

An Act to appropriate from the general fund of the state of Iowa to the state board of regents for capital improvements; repairs, replacements, alterations and equipment.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund
 2 of the state of Iowa to the state board of regents for capital
 3 improvements; repairs, replacements, alterations and equipment,
 4 the sum of eighteen million two hundred forty-three thousand four
 5 hundred forty dollars (\$18,243,440.00), the same being allotted
 6 to the various institutions under the state board of regents in
 7 the following amounts:

1 Sec. 2. Such sums for each institution shall be expended in
 2 accordance with the above list of priorities in the approximate
 3 estimated amounts. Such amounts and order of priority may be
 4 changed by the state board of regents with the approval of the
 5 budget and financial control committee.

1 Sec. 3. Preliminary plans, or descriptions, and a project esti-
 2 mate for improvements for which funds are hereinabove appropri-
 3 ated shall be submitted by the state board of regents to the
 4 budget and financial control committee for approval before bids
 5 on the improvements are requested. Contracts for construction of
 6 improvements for which funds are hereinabove appropriated and
 7 project budgets shall be submitted by the state board of regents
 8 to the budget and financial control committee for approval after
 9 bids are received. Items commonly known as change orders need
 10 not be submitted to the budget and financial control committee
 11 for approval unless such change orders actually increase the
 12 total cost of that particular contract by three (3) percent or
 13 more.

1 Sec. 4. The state board of regents and the budget and finan-
 2 cial control committee are hereby authorized to accept federal
 3 grants to the state to be used in connection with the funds here-
 4 inabove appropriated.

1 Sec. 5. Upon the completion of the contract documents and the
 2 determination of the total cost of any projects as set forth in

3 this Act, any unobligated balance remaining may be used for any
 4 repairs as needed at the respective institution and to supplement
 5 at such institution any appropriations for buildings, repairs,
 6 improvements, replacements, alterations, and equipment.

1 Sec. 6. Before any of the funds hereinabove appropriated
 2 shall be expended, it shall be determined by the state board of
 3 regents, with the approval of the budget and financial control
 4 committee, that the expenditure shall be for the best interests
 5 of the state.

1 Sec. 7. This Act being deemed of immediate importance shall
 2 be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publi-

1 Amend Senate File 474 by striking all after the enacting
 2 clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
 3 "Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general
 4 fund of the state to the board of regents the sum of sixteen
 5 million (16,000,000) dollars to be used in the following manner,
 6 to wit:
 7 To supplement any appropriations for capital improvement items
 8 for construction of new buildings, repairs, improvements,
 9 replacements, or alternations, or for any other capital expendi-
 10 tures the board of regents may deem necessary for the proper and
 11 necessary function of any institution under its jurisdiction.
 12 "Sec. 2. Before any of the funds herein appropriated shall be
 13 expended, it shall be determined by the board of regents, with
 14 the approval of the budget and financial control committee, that
 15 the expenditures shall be for the best interests of the state.
 16 "Sec. 3. Contracts, plans and specifications, or plan of
 17 operation for improvements for which funds are herein appropri-
 18 ated shall be submitted by the board of regents to the budget and
 19 financial control committee for approval, except that items com-
 20 monly known as change orders need not be submitted to the budget
 21 and financial control committee for approval unless such change
 22 orders actually increase the total cost of that particular proj-
 23 ect by three (3) percent or more.
 24 "Sec. 4. The board of regents and the budget and financial
 25 control committee are hereby authorized to accept federal grants
 26 to the state to be used in connection with the funds above
 27 appropriated.
 28 "Sec. 5. Any unencumbered balance remaining as of June 30,
 29 1967, of the appropriation of this Act made by the 60th general
 30 assembly, shall revert to the general fund of the state as of
 31 June 30, 1967.
 32 "Sec. 6. Section ninety-eight point six (98.6), Code 1962, is
 33 hereby amended by striking from line seven (7) of subsection one
 34 (1) the word 'two' and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'two
 35 and one-half (2½)'.
 36 Further amend by adding in line three (3) of the title after
 37 the word "equipment" the words "and to increase the tax imposed
 38 on cigarettes".
