A BILL FOR

An Act relating to the compensation of county officers, deputies and clerks.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. The annual compensation of the county auditor,
2 county treasurer, county recorder, clerk of the district court,
3 and county sheriff shall be computed from the following table:

73 The annual compensation shall be the sums of the salary in column
74 "A" based on population, when added to the salary shown in column
75 "B" based on taxable valuation less the valuation of moneys and
76 credits.

1 Sec. 2. In countries having a population of forty thousand
2 (40,000) or over in which there is a city of fifteen thousand
3 (15,000) or more population, of any form of government, the board
4 of supervisors may allow additional compensation to the county
5 treasurer not to exceed fifty (50) dollars per annum for each five
6 thousand (5,000) population of such cities in excess of fifteen
7 thousand (15,000). When such county has a city with a population
8 of seventy-five thousand (75,000) or over, the board of super-
9 visors shall allow additional compensation in an amount not less
10 than twenty-five (25) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars
11 for each five thousand (5,000) population of such cities in excess
12 of seventy-five thousand (75,000); provided however, that in no
13 case shall such allowance exceed five hundred (500) dollars.

1 Sec. 3. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall
2 receive the same compensation as other elected county officials
3 under this Act plus statutory mileage as provided by Chapter 79,
4 except as follows:

5 1. In counties with less than thirty-five thousand (35,000)
6 population each member of the board shall receive a per diem com-
7 pensation of eighteen (18) dollars per day for all meetings to
8 include committee meetings.

9 2. In counties with a seven (7) member board and which are
10 not on a per diem basis, each member of the board shall receive
11 an annual compensation equal to four sevenths ($\frac{4}{7}$) that of other
12 elected county officials under this Act.

13 3. In counties having a five (5) member board and a population
14 of more than thirty-five thousand (35,000) but less than sixty
15 thousand (60,000) but with a taxable valuation of thirty million

16 (30,000,000) or more, each member shall receive an annual compen-
17 sation to four fifths ($\frac{4}{5}$) the compensation of other elected
18 county officials under this Act; if the taxable valuation is less
19 than thirty million (30,000,000), each member shall receive an
20 annual compensation equal to three fifths ($\frac{3}{5}$) the compensation
21 of other elected county officials under this Act.

22 4. In counties having a population of sixty thousand (60,000)
23 but less than two hundred fifty thousand (250,000), each member
24 of the board shall receive an annual compensation equal to seventy
25 (70) per cent of the compensation of other elected county officials
26 under this Act.

1 Sec. 4. In July of the year of nineteen hundred sixty-five
2 (1965) for the remainder of such year and in each succeeding
3 December for each year thereafter, the board of supervisors shall,
4 by resolution, fix the salaries of the officials in conformity
5 with the schedule based on population as shown in the last current
6 report of the bureau of census, United States department of com-
7 merce and on the taxable valuation of the county as certified by
8 the Iowa state tax commission or in conformity with this Act.
9 If a vacancy occurs in any office, the person who is appointed or
10 elected to fill the unexpired term in the office vacated, shall
11 receive the same salary as the person vacating the office.

1 Sec. 5. In any county where the sheriff is not furnished a
2 residence by the county, an additional sum of six hundred dollars
3 per annum shall be paid.

1 Sec. 6. The first and second deputies and the deputy in
2 charge of the motor vehicle registration and title department,
3 may be paid an amount not to exceed eighty percent of the amount

4 of the annual salary of his or her principal. In counties where
 5 more than two deputies are required, said deputies may be paid an
 6 amount not to exceed seventy-five percent of the annual salary of
 7 his or her principal. Upon certification to the board of super-
 8 visors by the elected official concerned, the amount of the annual
 9 salary for each deputy as above provided, the board of supervisors
 10 shall certify to the county auditor of any such county the annual
 11 salary certified by the elected officials, but in no event shall
 12 said board of supervisors be required to certify to the auditor of
 13 any such county an amount in excess of the amounts authorized
 14 above. The board of supervisors shall fix all compensation for extra
 15 help and clerks.

1 Sec. 7. In any county in which there exists a city, not the
 2 county seat, having a population of six thousand or over, the
 3 treasurer may appoint a resident deputy collector of taxes for
 4 such city and vicinity under bond as provided for other deputies,
 5 and his compensation shall be the same percentage of the treasurer's
 6 salary as the chief deputy and second deputy in such county. Such
 7 resident deputy collector shall maintain an office in such city
 8 for a period of approximately five weeks each spring and fall,
 9 such periods to terminate on April 1 and October 1 respectively
 10 or as soon thereafter as possible. The treasurer in such case
 11 shall prepare the necessary books and records for such deputy
 12 each year, and the board of supervisors is authorized to allow
 13 payment of incidental expenses pertaining to the operations of
 14 such office, not to exceed one hundred dollars per year.

 8 are hereby repealed.

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 349

The purpose of this bill is to bring the salaries by county officials more in line with the salaries being paid by private industry and local, state and federal government agencies. County officials for many years have been given only a very small token increase in salaries and in order to attract good, substantial candidates for county offices, it is necessary that the salaries for county offices be brought to a level that will permit elected officials to live with dignity and attract high caliber candidates for said county offices.

An Act relating to the compensation of county officers, deputies
and clerks.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. The annual compensation of the county auditor,
