# A BILL FOR

An Act relating to gasoline receptacles.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa: filed 7/30 prevailed

passed Senate as amended

- 1 Section 1. Section two hundred eight point six (208.6), Code 7/30 (56-0)
- 2 1962, is hereby amended as follows:
- 3 1. By striking from line four (4) the word "bottle,"
- 4 2. By striking from line nine (9) the words "red lettering"
- 5 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "contrasting letters".
- 6 3. By adding thereto the following sentence:
- 7 "Gasoline or other petroleum products having a flash point
- 8 below one hundred (100) degrees Fahrenheit shall not be placed in
- 9 bottles."

### EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 591

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit the placing of gasoline in bottles. This bill further provides that gasoline placed or stored shall be placed in receptacles which are plainly marked with the word "gasoline" or the words "flammable—keep fire away" in lettering contrasting with the container. Statute now provides that gasoline be placed in receptacles painted red and that the lettering on the receptacles be painted red. The requirement of red lettering on a red background makes the lettering difficult to read. The changes incorporated into this bill are in accord with the rules of the State Fire Marshal.
