A BILL FOR

An Act relating to supervision of dancing where beer is sold.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Section one hundred twenty-four point thirty-nine
- 2 (124.39), Code 1962, is hereby amended by striking all of
- 3 subsection two (2) of such section.

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 64

The intent of this bill is to eliminate the provision that beer permittees having dancing must hire policemen. The statute as presently written creates a conflict of interest in enforcement and it places an unnecessary financial burden on the licensee or permittee and is not a realistic control measure.

Further, this provision is not uniformly enforced around the state and there are a number of police officers where the measure is enforced who believe the dance police supervisor should be eliminated.
