## A BILL FOR

An Act to amend chapter one hundred fourteen (114), Acts of the 60th General Assembly relating to qualifications for a liquor license.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

- 1 Section 1. Chapter one hundred fourteen (114), Acts of the
- 2 60th General Assembly is amended by striking the comma (,) after
- 3 the word "felony" in line twelve (12) of section ten (10) and
- 4 adding thereto the following: "within a period of three years
- 5 prior to date of application,".

### EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 75

The purpose of this bill is to set a time limit during which those convicted of a felony or an indictable misdemeanor may qualify for a beer permit. Until passage of Iowa's realistic control act, many persons held a record of violation and consequently a wife or some other member of the family has a license in their name although they are not the actual operators of the establishment. This bill removes the subterfuge many operators will not have to hide behind with time.

- 7 of the application for a license, and if the applicant's rights of
- 8 citizenship have been restored by the governor, the commission may
- 9 license notwithstanding such conviction." issue a
