A BILL FOR

An Act to require the wearing of eye protective devices by students and teachers.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Every student and teacher in any public school
- 2 participating in any of the following courses:
 - 3 1. Vocational or industrial arts shops or laboratories
 - 4 involving experience with any of the following:
 - 5 a. Hot molten metals;
 - 6 b. Milling, sawing, turning, shaping, cutting,
 - 7 grinding, or stamping of any solid materials;
 - 8 c. Heat treatment, tempering, or kiln firing of
 - 9 any metal or other materials;
 - 10 d. Gas or electric arc welding;
 - 11 e. Repair or servicing of any vehicle;
 - 12 f. Caustic or explosive materials;
 - 13 2. Chemical or combined chemical-physical laboratories
 - 14 involving caustic or explosive chemicals or hot liquids or
 - 15 solids;
 - 16 is required to wear industrial quality eye protective devices
 - 17 at all times while participating in such courses or laboratories.
 - 18 such devices shall be furnished for all students, teachers and
 - 19 visitors by the school. Such devices may be purchased in large
 - 20 quantities and sold at cost to students and teachers.

21 "Industrial quality eye protective devices," as used in
22 this section, means devices meeting the standards of the
23 American Standards Association Safety Code for Head, Eye,
24 and Respiratory Protection, Z2.1-1959, promulgated by the
25 American Standards Association, Inc.

SENATE FILE 228

- 1 Amend Senate File 228 by striking from lines 17, 18, 19 and 20
- 2 all after the word "participating" in line 17 and inserting in lieu
- 3 thereof the following:
- 4 "in any phase or activity of such course which may subject the
- 5 student or teacher to the risk or hazard of eye injury from the
- 6 materials or processes used in said courses. It shall be the duty
- 7 of the teacher or other person supervising the students in said
- 8 courses to see that the above requirements are complied with. Any
- 9 student failing to comply with such requirements may be temporarily
- 10 suspended from participation in said course and the registration of
- 11 a student for such course may be cancelled for willful, flagrant or
- 12 repeated failure to observe the above requirements. The willful
- 13 failure of any teacher or person supervising the students in courses
- 14 covered by this Act to perform the duties required herein shall
- 15 constitute a misdemeanor. The board of education having jurisdiction
- 16 of any school coming within the purview of this Act shall provide
- 17 the safety devices required herein. Such devices may be paid for
- 18 from the general fund but the board may require students and teacher
- 19 to pay for said devices and shall make them available to students
- 20 and teachers at no more than the actual cost to the district."
