An Act relating to vehicles used for the transportation of fertilizers and chemicals used for farm crop production.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one point one (321.1),
2 Code 1962, is hereby amended by striking the last sentence of
3 subsection sixteen (16) thereof.

1 Sec. 2. Section three hundred twenty-one point one (321.1),
2 Code 1962, subsection seventeen (17) thereof, is amended by
3 inserting after the word "including" in line five (5) thereof,
4 the following:

5 "trailers and bulk spreaders which are not self-propelled
6 having a gross weight of not more than six (6) tons used for the
7 transportation of fertilizers and chemicals used for farm crop
8 production, and other equipment used primarily for the application
9 of fertilizers and chemicals in farm fields or for farm storage,
10 but not including trucks mounted with applicators of such pro-
11 ducts,".

1 Sec. 3. Section three hundred twenty-one point one hundred
2 twenty-three (321.123), Code 1962, is hereby amended by adding
3 thereto the following new subsection:

4 "Trailers and bulk spreaders which are not self-propelled
5 having a gross weight of not more than six (6) tons used for the
6 transportation of fertilizers and chemicals used for farm crop

7 production, five dollars (\$5.00),”

1 Sec. 4. Section three hundred twenty-one point three hundred

2 eighty-three (321.383), Code 1962, is hereby amended by inserting

3 after the comma (,) in line three (3) thereof the following:

4 “bulk spreaders and other fertilizer and chemical equipment

5 defined as special mobile equipment.”

EXPLANATION OF AMENDMENT TO
SENATE FILE 388

1 Section 321.118, Code 1962, provides for registration fees

2 of \$40.00 for certain vehicles which are primarily used in

3 agricultural pursuits. It would seem that a truck on which a

4 fertilizer application apparatus is mounted would fit into this

5 category and should be taxed in the same manner.
