A BILL FOR

An Act relating to the prefiling and printing of bills and resolutions prior to the convening of the general assembly.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- 1 Section 1. Chapter two (2), Code 1966, is hereby amended
- 2 by adding thereto the following new section:
- 3 "The general assembly may authorize by resolution the
- 4 prefiling and printing of bills and resolutions prior to the
- 5 convening of a subsequent general assembly session. The print-
- 6 ing shall be accomplished under the rules controlling the
- 7 printing of bills and resolutions during the general assembly
- 8 session. Printing authorized under a resolution shall be paid
- 9 as designated in section two point ten (2.10) of the Code.
- 10 Bills and resolutions printed under the provisions of this
- 11 section shall not be distributed until the session convenes."

EXPLANATION

This bill gives statutory recognition to the practice of prefiling and printing of bills and resolutions prior to the convening of the General Assembly session. Prefiling and the early printing of legislation will help eliminate the pressure placed on the drafting and printing processes at the beginning of each session of the General Assembly.

12 printed shall be distributed to the elected members
13 of the general assembly by the chief clerk of the house
14 and the secretary of the senate. All bills and joint
15 resolutions so proposed and printed shall be assigned to
16 regular standing committees by the presiding officers of
17 the houses when the general assembly convenes."

6 person elected to serve in the forthcoming regular or special
7 session of the general assembly, or any interim legislative
8 committee when authorized by statute or rule may submit and
9 have printed bills and joint resolutions for introduction
10 into the general assembly. The submission and printing shall
11 be made under the rules on introduction of bills and resolu-
12 tions and on printing prevailing at the previous session of
13 the general assembly. Costs of printing shall be paid in
14 accordance with section two point ten (2.10) of the Code.

28 and resolutions which such departments and agencies wish to be
29 considered by the general assembly. All bills and resolutions
30 so filed shall be assigned by the presiding officers to regular
31 standing committees for consideration."
