An Act to establish the judicial districts for the district courts and to provide for determination of the number of judges in each district.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. Section six hundred four point eight (604.8),
2 Code 1966, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in
3 lieu thereof:

4 "For judicial purposes the state is hereby divided into
5 twelve judicial districts as follows:

6 "The first district shall consist of the counties of Lee,
7 Van Buren, Jefferson, Henry, Des Moines and Louisa.

8 "The second district shall consist of the counties of Davis,
9 Appanoose, Wayne, Decatur, Ringgold, Union, Clarke, Lucas,
10 Monroe and Wapello.

11 "The third district shall consist of the counties of Taylor,
12 Page, Fremont, Mills, Montgomery, Adams, Cass, Pottawattamie,
13 Harrison, Shelby and Audubon.

14 "The fourth district shall consist of the counties of Craw-
15 ford, Monona, Woodbury, Plymouth, Cherokee, Ida and Sac.

16 "The fifth district shall consist of the counties of Marion,
17 Warren, Madison, Adair, Guthrie, Dallas and Polk.

18 "The sixth district shall consist of the counties of Washing-
19 ton, Keokuk, Mahaska, Johnson, Iowa, Poweshiek and Jasper.

20 "The seventh district shall consist of the counties of Cedar,
21 Jones, Linn, Benton, Tama and Marshall.

22 "The eighth district shall consist of the counties of Scott,
23 Muscatine, Clinton, Jackson and Dubuque.

24 "The ninth district shall consist of the counties of Delaware,
25 Buchanan, Black Hawk, Grundy, Butler, Bremer, Fayette, Clayton,
26 Allamakee, Winneshiek, Howard and Chickasaw.

27 "The tenth district shall consist of the counties of Story,
28 Boone, Greene, Carroll, Calhoun, Humboldt, Webster, Hamilton
29 and Hardin.

30 "The eleventh district shall consist of the counties of
31 Franklin, Wright, Kossuth, Hancock, Cerro Gordo, Floyd, Mitchell,
32 Worth and Winnebago.

33 "The twelfth district shall consist of the counties of
34 Pocahontas, Buena Vista, Palo Alto, Clay, O'Brien, Sioux, Lyon,
35 Osceola, Dickinson and Emmet."

1 Sec. 2. Each of the above judicial districts on the effec-
2 tive date of this Act shall be entitled to such number of judges
3 as may be domiciled therein on that date. Thereafter the number
4 of judges in each district shall be adjusted until the number
5 of judges as hereinafter provided is achieved, but no incumbent
6 judge shall be removed from office and no new judgeship shall
7 be added in any district until a vacancy occurs in a district
8 having a surplus over said number.

9 By application of the following formula the number of judges
10 in each district is determined by giving equal weight to cases
11 filed and population. In districts containing a city of fifty
12 thousand or more population consideration being given to five
13 hundred fifty combined civil and criminal filings and forty
14 thousand population, or major fractions of either, per judge-
15 ship; and in all other districts consideration being given to
16 four hundred fifty combined civil and criminal filings and
17 forty thousand population, or major fractions of either per
18 judgeship. The number of judges in each district is so deter-
19 mined to be as follows:

- 20 First district 4 judges.
- 21 Second district 4 judges.
- 22 Third district 5 judges.
- 23 Fourth district 5 judges.
- 24 Fifth district 11 judges.
- 25 Sixth district 5 judges.
- 26 Seventh district 7 judges.
- 27 Eighth district 7 judges.
- 28 Ninth district 8 judges.
- 29 Tenth district 6 judges.
- 30 Eleventh district 5 judges.
- 31 Twelfth district 4 judges.

32 Provided, the district containing the seat of government
 33 shall be entitled to one additional judge.

34 In the event of a vacancy in any district having more than
 35 the designated number of judges and it therefor cannot be
 36 filled, a new appointment shall be made in another district
 37 which does not have the requisite number of judges as specified
 38 above; and in case there are two or more such districts, the
 39 appointment shall be made in the particular district where the
 40 excess in civil and criminal filings and population per resident
 41 judge is greatest giving equal consideration to filings and
 42 population. The figures on filings shall be for the latest
 43 available previous three-year period and when current census
 44 figures on population are not available, figures shall be taken
 45 from the state department of health computations. The chief
 46 justice shall make such determinations and notify the nominating
 47 commissions involved and the governor.

1 Sec. 3. Section forty-six point three (46.3), Code 1966, is
 2 hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

3 "In June, 1967, the governor shall appoint five electors in
 4 each of the judicial districts established by this Act to the
 5 district judicial nominating commission for terms commencing
 6 July 1, 1967. He shall appoint two such commissioners to serve

7 until June 30, 1969, two to serve until June 30, 1971, and one
8 to serve until June 30, 1973. Upon the expiration of each of
9 those terms and every six years thereafter, the governor shall
10 so appoint district judicial nominating commissioners for six-
11 year terms."

1 Sec. 4. Section forty-six point four (46.4), Code 1966, is
2 hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

3 "In June, 1967, the resident members of the bar of each
4 judicial district established by this Act shall elect five
5 electors of the district to the district judicial nominating
6 commission for terms commencing July 1, 1967. One of such com-
7 missioners shall serve until June 30, 1969, two until June 30,
8 1971 and two until June 30, 1973, as determined by lot by such
9 commissioners. In January next before expiration of each of
10 those terms and every six years thereafter, such members of
11 the bar of the respective judicial districts shall so elect
12 district judicial nominating commissioners for six-year terms"
13 commencing July 1 following."

1 Sec. 5. Except as hereafter provided this Act shall be
2 effective July 1, 1967.

1 Sec. 6. The terms of office of district judicial nominating
2 commissioners appointed and elected prior to the effective date
3 of this Act shall continue until July 1, 1967 at which date
4 said terms shall be deemed abolished.

1 Sec. 7. Sections three (3) to five (5), inclusive, of this
2 Act being deemed of immediate importance, this Act shall be
3 published in The Clarinda Herald-Journal, a newspaper published
4 at Clarinda, Iowa and in the Prairie City News, a newspaper pub-
5 lished at Prairie City, Iowa and from and after said publication
6 said sections shall be in full force and effect.

18 tion, or major fraction of either; in all other districts there shall
19 be one (1) judgeship per four hundred fifty (450) combined
20 civil and criminal filings and forty thousand (40,000) popula-

21 tion, or major fraction of either; provided, the seat of government
22 shall be entitled to one (1) additional judgeship. The figures
23 on filings shall be the average for the latest available pre-
vious

24 three-year (3) period and when current census figures on popula-
25 tion are not available, figures shall be taken from the state
26 department of health computations.

27 "3. A vacancy, for purposes of this Act, is defined as
28 the death, retirement, removal, or failure of retention in
29 office at the judicial election, of a judge.

30 "4. In those districts having more judges than the
31 number of judgeships specified by the formula set out in
32 subsection two (2) hereof, vacancies shall not be filled.

33 "5. In those districts having fewer judges or the
34 same number of judges as the number of judgeships specified
35 by the formula set out in subsection two (2) hereof, vacancies
36 in the number of judges shall be filled as they occur.

37 "6. In those districts having fewer judges than the
38 number of judgeships to which they are entitled under
39 subsection two (2) hereof, the appointment of an additional
40 judge over the number presently existing shall be made only
41 when there is a vacancy in a district having more judges,
42 prior to such vacancy, than the number to which it is

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43 entitled under subsection two (2) hereof; and in case there
44 are two or more districts with a deficiency in the number of
45 judges under the number of judgeships to which they are
46 entitled under subsection two (2) hereof, the appointment
47 shall be made in the particular district where the excess in
48 civil and criminal filings and population per resident judge
49 is greatest, giving consideration to filings and population
50 as specified in subsection two (2) hereof.

51 "7. After the number of judges in each district equals
52 the proper number of judgeships, as determined under subsec-
53 tion two (2) hereof, subsection six (6) hereof shall be of
54 no further effect. Thereafter, a new judge shall be appointed
55 in any district which becomes entitled to an additional
56 judgeship, under subsection two (2) hereof; and vacancies
57 shall not be filled in any district which may become entitled
58 to fewer judgeships under said subsection; but no incumbent
59 judge shall ever be removed from office by reason thereof.

60 "8. On January 2 of each year, and at such other times
61 as may be appropriate, the chief justice shall make the
62 determinations required under this Act, and shall notify
63 the nominating commissions involved and the governor of any
64 appointments that may be required as a result thereof.

66 judges and other court personnel from one judicial district
67 to another, on a continuing basis, if need be, in order to
68 provide a sufficient number of judges to handle the judicial
