A BILL FOR

An Act authorizing capital expenditures by the state highway commission from the primary road fund.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 Section 1. The state highway commission is hereby autho-
2 rized to expend from the primary road fund the sum of four
3 million (4,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be neces-
4 sary, to be used in the following manner:

5	1. Traffic weigh stations.	\$ 710,000.00
6	2. Ames area improvements and construction	43,000.00
7	3. Land, construction, and repairs of	
8	maintenance facilities	<u>3,247,000.00</u>

9 Grand total of all appropriations for all
10 purposes of this Act for the state highway
11 commission \$4,000,000.00

1 Sec. 2. The state highway commission is hereby authorized
2 to obtain and accept any federal grants and funds to the state
3 to be used in connection with the funds authorized in this Act,
4 and federal funds in addition thereto.

1 Sec. 3. Any unencumbered balance remaining as of June 30,
2 1971 of the authorization for funds in this Act shall revert
3 to the primary road fund as of June 30, 1971.

1 Sec. 4. When the state highway commission has approved a
2 project to be financed with funds authorized in this Act, a
3 description of said project and estimated cost shall be re-
4 ported to the governor and state comptroller for allocation

5 of funds.

1 Sec. 5. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence,
2 clause or phrase of this Act is for any reason held to be
3 unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or
4 invalidity shall not affect the constitutionality or validity
5 of the remaining portions of this Act. The general assembly
6 hereby declares that it would have passed this Act and each
7 section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
8 hereof irrespective of whether any one or more of the sec-
9 tions, subsections, paragraphs, clauses or phrases be declared
10 unconstitutional.
