A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to support and maintenance of criminal sexual
2 psychopaths.

3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

4 Section 1. Section two hundred twenty-five A point four-
5 teen (225A.14), Code 1966, is hereby repealed and the
6 following enacted in lieu thereof:

7 "Any person committed to the state hospital under the
8 provisions of this chapter shall be supported and maintained
9 at the expense of the state."

10 Sec. 4. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
11 shall take effect and be in force from and after its pub-
12 lication in the Marshalltown Times-Republican, a newspaper published
13 in Marshalltown, Iowa, and in the Eldora Herald-Ledger,
14 a newspaper published in Eldora, Iowa.

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 126

This bill provides that the state shall pay for the confinement of criminal sexual psychopaths in the same manner as it pays for the confinement of inmates of the penitentiary.
