A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to driver education instructors.

2 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

3 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one point one
4 hundred eighty (321.180), Code 1966, as amended by chapter
5 two hundred seventy-two (272), section one (1), Acts of the
6 Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby repealed and the
7 following enacted in lieu thereof:

8 "Any person who is at least fourteen years of age and
9 who, except for his lack of instructions in operating a
10 motor vehicle, would otherwise be qualified to obtain an
11 operator's license, shall upon meeting the requirements of
12 section three hundred twenty-one point one hundred eighty-six
13 (321.186) other than driving demonstration, and upon paying the
14 required fee, be issued a temporary instruction permit by the
15 department, entitling the permittee while having such permit
16 in his immediate possession to drive a motor vehicle upon the
17 highways for a period of two years from the date of issuance
18 when accompanied by a licensed operator or chauffeur who is at
19 least twenty-one years of age, or an approved driver education
20 instructor, or a prospective driver education instructor who is
21 enrolled in and has been specifically designated by a teacher
22 education institution with a safety education program approved
23 by the department of public instruction, and who is actually
24 occupying a seat beside the driver; except that any instruction
25 permit issued to a person who is less than sixteen years of age

1 shall entitle such permittee to drive a motor vehicle upon
2 the highways only when accompanied by a parent or guardian,
3 or an approved driver education instructor, or a prospective
4 driver education instructor, who is enrolled in and has been
5 specifically designated by a teacher education institution with
6 a safety education program approved by the department of public
7 instruction, or by any person who is twenty-five years of age
8 or more if written permission is granted by the parent or
9 guardian, who is a holder of a valid operator's or a chauffeur's
10 license, and who is actually occupying a seat beside the driver.

EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 277

This bill allows an approved driver education instructor or a prospective driver education teacher, who is enrolled in, and who has been specifically designed by, a teacher education institution with a safety education program approved by the Department of Public Instruction, to train students in the area of driver education. As of now, it is impossible for a driver education student teacher to have any on-the-job training—this bill will allow it.
