## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to compensation of the members of the county
- 2 board of social welfare.
- 3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
- 4 Section 1. Section two hundred thirty-four point ten
- 5 (234.10), Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:
- 6 1. By striking from line five (5) the word "three" and
- 7 inserting in lieu thereof the word "six (6)".
- 8 2. By striking from line seven (7) the word "ninety"
- 9 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "one hundred fifty".
- 10 3. By striking lines eight (8) through eleven (11), inclu-
- 11 sive, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "year. The
- 12 expenses and com-".

### EXPLANATION OF HOUSE FILE 62

The present rate of compensation for members of the county board of social welfare has remained the same as it was at the time of enactment of this statute effective May 28, 1937. Inasmuch as compensation rates for state and county officials in various categories have been raised substantially in recent years, it seems that members of the county board of social welfare are entitled to an upward adjustment of their rate of compensation.

Prepared in regard to a bill for an act relating to compensation of the members of the County Board of Social Welfare.

Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Rule 47: No cost to state involved.

2nd year	12,000
3rd year	12,000
4th year	12,000
5th year	12,000

Note: The above amounts are based on monthly meetings in each of the ninety-nine counties, of which eighty-one have three member boards and eighteen have five member boards. The total annual cost will be increased by 100 per cent by the increase in per diem rates from \$3 to \$6. Very few counties, if any, hold meetings the maximum number of times allowed annually. These fees will be paid from the County General Fund.
