5 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

6 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general
7 fund of the state for each year of the biennium beginning
8 July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971, for the department of
9 social services, including board of parole, for all purposes
10 including public assistance, salaries, support, maintenance,
11 repairs, replacements, alterations, equipment, and miscellan-
12 eous purposes for the department's general administration,
13 bureau offices, institutions, welfare services, and parole
14 services, the following amounts, or so much thereof as may
15 be necessary, to be used for the following purposes, to wit:

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

17 1. For the administration of the office of the commis-
18 sioner of social services, including the council of social
19 services, the office of the deputy commissioner, the office
20 of planning and budgeting, the office of administrative ser-
21 vices, the office of personnel and staff development, the
22 office of public information, and the office of architectural
23 and engineering services and divisions thereof:

34 Sec. 2. The salary of the commissioner of social services
 35 shall be twenty-four thousand (24,000) dollars for each year

1 of the biennium.

2 Sec. 3. The budget of total expenditures for each institu-
3 tion under the department of social services during the biennium
4 shall not exceed the state appropriation and transfers under
5 section eight point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code for each in-
6 stitution set forth in this Act, except that the gross salary
7 expenditure shall be adjusted by the maintenance recovery in
8 arriving at the total expenditure.

9 The maintenance recovery is the rental charge to employees
10 or others for room, apartment, or house and meals.

11 All other institutional receipts shall be deposited to the
12 state general fund.

13 Sec. 4. The department may use appropriated funds for the
14 granting of educational leave upon approval of the commissioner.

15 Sec. 5. The mental health institutes' daily per diem as
16 determined by section two hundred thirty point twenty (230.20)
17 of the Code, shall be billed at eighty percent for the biennium.

18 Sec. 6. The state hospital schools' daily per diem as
19 determined by section two hundred twenty-two point seventy-
20 three (222.73) of the Code, shall be billed at eighty percent
21 for the biennium.

22 Sec. 7. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be used for
23 capital improvements.

24 Sec. 8. Where any provisions of the law of this state are
25 in conflict with this Act, examples of which are, but not
26 limited to, sections two hundred thirty-nine point twelve
27 (239.12) and two hundred forty-one point twenty-one (241.21)
28 of the Code, the provisions of this Act shall govern for
29 the biennium.

30 Sec. 9. The provisions of chapter eight (8) of the Code
31 shall apply to this Act.

32 Sec. 10. Any balance remaining in the funds to which ap-
33 propriations are made by this Act at the end of the ensuing
34 biennium shall revert to the general fund of the state, except
35 that balances not to exceed the following specified amounts

1 may be retained in each fund:

2 Aid to the blind fund\$ 60,000.00
 3 Aid to dependent children fund 775,000.00
 4 Aid to the disabled fund 105,000.00

5 Sec. 11. No employee of the department of social services
 6 shall receive an annual salary in excess of thirty thousand
 7 dollars.

8 Sec. 12. Section two hundred twenty-six point two (226.2),
 9 Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:

10 1. By inserting in line two (2) after the word "be" the
 11 words "either a qualified hospital administrator or".

12 2. By striking all after the period in line five (5) and
 13 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

14 "No physician may serve as both superintendent and business
 15 manager. When a hospital administrator is appointed superin-
 16 tendent he may also be designated to perform the duties of
 17 business manager, without additional compensation therefor,
 18 and a physician having the requisite qualifications for ap-
 19 pointment as superintendent shall be designated clinical
 20 director and shall perform the duties imposed on the superin-
 21 tendent by section two hundred twenty-six point six (226.6),
 22 subsection one (1), and such other duties of the superinten-
 23 dent as must by their nature be performed by a physician."

REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE
 (House File 819)

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representa-
 tives:

We, the undersigned members of the conference committee appointed to consider the difference between the Senate and the House of Representatives on House File 819, a bill for an act to appropriate from the general fund of the state to the department of social services and the board of parole and relating to the administration of programs of such department, respectfully submit the following recommendation:

That the Senate amendment striking section eleven (11) of House File 819 be amended by inserting in lieu of such section the following:

"Sec. 11. The director of the bureau of mental health of the department of social services shall receive an annual salary of thirty-one thousand six hundred sixty (31,660) dollars."

1 Amend House File 819 by inserting after line twenty-one
2 (21) page two (2) the following:
3 "The commissioner of the department of social services is
4 hereby authorized to establish a detention care program at the
5 Annie Wittenmyer Home in the city of Davenport. Such deten-
6 tion care may be offered to any city or county served by the
7 Annie Wittenmyer Home at the discretion of the commissioner of
8 the department of social services. The commissioner shall
9 establish operating rules and regulations to provide fair and
10 equitable charges for such services by separating the costs of
11 detention care from the normal costs of providing services for
12 children committed to the Annie Wittenmyer Home. The total
13 cost of detention care shall be charged on a per patient per
14 diem to the city or county responsible for the admission of
15 such patient. Such funds received from detention care shall
16 be deposited in the general fund of the state and such funds
17 are hereby appropriated back to the Annie Wittenmyer Home in the
18 city of Davenport. In determining the charges for other children
19 placed in the Annie Wittenmyer Home at Davenport, the amount
20 received for detention care shall be deducted from the total
21 operating costs before per diem for the other children is
22 determined as provided in chapter two hundred thirty-two (232)
23 of the Code."
