1 An Act relating to driver license fees and their renewal.

2 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

3 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one point one

EXPLANATION

Drivers licenses are presently issued for a period of two years. The vast majority of persons between the ages of 21 and 65 receive their renewal license as a matter of course. This is needless administrative red tape. This bill doubles the license fee and doubles the length of time for which drivers and chauffeurs licenses are issued. This will eliminate such needless administrative red tape.

FISCAL NOTE

Requested by Senator Kyhl.

Prepared in regard to Senate File 1181, a bill for an Act relating to driver license fees and their renewal.

Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Rule 31:

During the first two year period, January 1, 1971, to December 31, 1973, Senate File 1181 and the Kyhl amendment to Senate File 1181 would produce excess revenue over the cost of colored photos totaling about \$4,295,000 per year.

This amount is arrived at as follows:

Cost of colored photos:

Personnel cost	\$ 250,000
Equipment cost	430,000
Cost of office equipment and mobile facilities	25,000
Total yearly cost for 1,000,000 licenses	705,000

Additional revenue received during first two year period

as a result of doubling license fees 5,000,000

Excess of yearly receipts over cost for first 2 years\$4,295,000

For the years 1973 and 1974 the gross income from drivers licenses would be from new applications and persons under 21 years of age and over 65 years of age. The revenue from licenses would be approximately \$900,000 per year.

For 1975 the yearly gross revenue from drivers license fees would be approximately \$2,500,000.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

We, the undersigned members of the conference committee appointed to consider the difference between the Senate and the House of Representatives on Senate File 1181, a bill for an Act relating to driver license fees and their renewal, respectfully submit the following recommendations.

- 1. The Senate concur in amendment 1, 2, 3 and 4.
- 2. The house recede from amendment 5.
- 3. Amend amendment 6 by striking lines 1 and 2 and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "6. Page 2, by striking lines 27 through 35, and on page 3, all of lines 1 through 18 and insert the following:

Sec. 5. Chapter three hundred twenty-one (321), Code 1966, is hereby amended by adding the following new section thereto:

A resident of this state who is legally blind may apply to the department in the manner provided by law for a four-year operator's license. The department shall upon payment of the required fee issue such person an operator's license upon the usual license form as set forth in section three hundred twenty-one point one hundred eighty-nine (321.189) of the Code. However, such license shall not grant the person to whom it is issued the privilege to operate any motor vehicle, or to supervise another in such operation. It shall be plainly stamped across the face of such license that it is for identification only and that it is not valid for the operation of a motor vehicle. Such license shall be valid for the period of four years and be renewable as other operators' licenses. An applicant for an operator's license or renewal thereof pursuant to this Act, shall not be subject to or required to pass an examination as provided in section three hundred twenty-one point one hundred eighty-six (321.186) and three hundred twenty-one point one hundred ninety-six (321.196) of the Code.
