- 1 An Act relating to municipal court clerks and bailiffs.
- 2 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
- 3 Section 1. Section six hundred two point forty-nine (602.49),
- 4 Code 1966, as amended by chapter three hundred ninety-eight
- 5 (398), section one (1), Acts of the Sixty-second General Assem-
- 6 bly, is hereby further amended as follows:
- 7 1. By striking from line four (4) the words "Each clerk
- 8 shall receive an".
- 9 2. By striking lines five (5) through twenty-six (26),
- 10 inclusive, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 11 "The city council shall set the salaries of the clerk,
- 12 bailiff, and all deputies."

EXPLANATION

This bill removes the salary ceilings for municipal court clerks and bailiffs, which are presently graduated according to the size of cities, and provides that the city council shall set salaries.

6 "Sec. 2. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1970, the
7 annual salary of municipal court clerks and bailiffs is increased
8 two thousand one hundred dollars above the salary in effect on
9 July 1, 1969. Thereafter, the provisions of section six hundred
10 two point forty-nine (602.49) of the Code, as amended by this
11 Act, shall apply."

12 *board of supervisors*, set the salaries of the clerk, bailiff,
13 and all deputies."

14 *Sec. 2. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1970,*
15 *the annual salary of municipal court clerks and bailiffs is*
16 *increased two thousand one hundred dollars above the salary*
17 *in effect on July 1, 1969. Thereafter, the provisions of*
18 *section six hundred two point forty-nine (602.49) of the Code,*
19 *as amended by this Act, shall apply.*

20 *Sec. 3. This Act being deemed of immediate importance*
21 *shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication*
22 *in The Telegraph-Herald, a newspaper published at Dubuque,*
23 *Iowa, and the Marshalltown Times-Republican, a newspaper*
24 *published at Marshalltown, Iowa.*

EXPLANATION
