## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act creating authority in the department of social services
- 2 to transfer aid to dependent children funds to any other
- 3 department or agency of the state of Iowa for the purpose
- 4 of implementing federal assistance programs.
- 5 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
- 6 Section 1. Chapter two hundred thirty-nine (239), Code
- 7 1966, is hereby amended by adding the following thereto:
- 8 "The department of social services shall be authorized to
- 9 transfer such of the aid to the dependent children funds in its
- 10 control to any other department or agency of the state of Iowa
- 11 for the purpose of providing funds to carry out the work incen-
- 12 tive program created by 1967 amendments to the Social Security
- 13 Act, amending Title four (IV) by creating sections forty-two
- 14 six hundred thirty (42-630) through forty-two six hundred forty-
- 15 four (42-644), inclusive, and nothing in the laws of the state
- 16 of Iowa shall be construed as limiting the authority granted by
- 17 that Act."
- 18 Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
- 19 shall take effect and be in force from and after its publica-
- 20 tion in *The Iowegian and Citizen*, a newspaper published in
- 21 Centerville, Iowa, and in the *Neola Gazette-Reporter*, a news-
- 22 paper published in Neola, Iowa.

### EXPLANATION OF SENATE FILE 254

Frequently the Department of Health, Education and Welfare will initiate a new program which requires matching state funds to implement it. For example, Part C of the WIN Program relates to the hard core, unemployable ADC recipients and the Labor Department has been delegated the responsibility of carrying out the provision of the Act. It is

necessary for us to transfer to the Employment Security Commission, who is responsible in Iowa for carrying out the provisions of the WIN Program, that portion of the ADC grant money which would be used for these ADC recipients. The Attorney General has ruled that as the Code presently reads, we could not transfer these monies regardless of how desirable the program is. In this case, no additional state monies are needed but the present monies available merely need to be transferred. This bill will give the Department, with the approval of the Governor and the Comptroller, the right to transfer funds.
