A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the law-enforcement officers' training
2 academy.

3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

4 Section 1. Chapter one hundred twelve (112), section three
5 (3), Acts of the Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby
6 amended by striking from lines two (2) and three (3) the words
7 "division of the department of public safety".

8 Sec. 2. Chapter one hundred twelve (112), section five
9 (5), Acts of the Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby
10 amended by striking from line two (2) the words "commissioner
11 of public safety" and inserting in lieu thereof the words
12 "office of the governor".

13 Sec. 3. Chapter one hundred twelve (112), Acts of the
14 Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby amended by adding
15 to the end thereof the following new section:

16 "The Iowa law-enforcement academy council shall submit to
17 the state comptroller, annually and in such form as required
18 by chapter eight (8) of the Code, estimates of its expendi-
19 ture requirements. Such estimates shall include the costs
20 of administration, maintenance, and operation, and the cost
21 of any proposed capital improvements or additional programs."

EXPLANATION OF SENATE FILE 344

Since the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy is required to coordinate training of all law-enforcement officers within the State and to set standards for the entire law-enforcement service, the desirability of the administration and control of the Academy being placed within a department representing a small segment of the law-enforcement profession is questionable. The Academy must be able to operate for the common good of the entire law-enforcement profession and must be free of any allegation,

real or imagined, that it is subject to undue influence, or control, by any one group within the profession.

It is for these reasons that the attached legislation, removing the Academy from the Department of Public Safety, is submitted.

- 2 21 a new section as follows:
- 3 "The moneys appropriated to the department of public
- 4 safety by chapter forty-six (46), Acts of the Sixty-third
- 5 General Assembly, First Session, section one (1), subsection
- 6 eight (8), for the Iowa law-enforcement academy, not expended
- 7 or encumbered are hereby transferred and reappropriated to
- 8 the office of the governor for the same purpose during the
- 9 fiscal year commencing July 1, 1970, and the state comptroller
- 10 is directed to allocate said appropriation pursuant to chapter
- 11 eight (8) of the Code."
