## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of an office for planning  
2 and programming to promote coordination of efforts of state  
3 agencies and local governments under the office of the gov-  
4 ernor.

5 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

6 Section 1. There is hereby created the office for planning  
7 and programming which will be directly attached to and a part  
8 of the office of the governor. The governor may appoint a  
9 director of planning and programming and other necessary per-  
10 sonnel. Such employees, except the director and his first  
11 assistant who shall serve at the pleasure of the governor,  
12 shall be subject to the provisions of chapter ninety-five  
13 (95), Act of the Sixty-second General Assembly.

14 Sec. 2. For purposes of this Act, unless the context  
15 otherwise requires:

16 1. "Federal aid" means any federal grants, loans, or  
17 other federal assistance whether or not state or local funds  
18 are required to match or contribute toward the costs of the  
19 program for which the aid is available.

20 2. "Private aid" means any grants, loans, or other as-  
21 sistance available from nonprofit corporations, foundations,  
22 and all private or nongovernmental sources, whether or not  
23 state or local funds are required to match or contribute  
24 toward the costs of the program for which the aid is avail-  
25 able.

1 3. "State agency" means any departments, boards, commis-  
2 sions, or agencies of state government, or any subunit  
3 thereof, except the legislative and judicial departments and  
4 agencies thereof.

5 4. "Local governments" means any counties, municipal  
6 corporations, or other political subdivisions of this state.

7 Sec. 3. The primary responsibility of the office for  
8 planning and programming shall be to coordinate the develop-  
9 ment of physical, economic, and human resource programs and  
10 to promote efficient and economic utilization of federal,  
11 state, local, and private resources. To this end, the office  
12 shall:

13 1. Prepare comprehensive state-wide recommendations and  
14 plans, as directed by the governor.

15 2. Prepare and submit economic reports appraising the  
16 economic situation of the state, economic growth and develop-  
17 ment of the state as it pertains to employment and income,  
18 and any other economic factors, as directed by the governor.

19 3. Coordinate its activities with the state comptroller  
20 so that any comprehensive state-wide planning program is  
21 consistent with the anticipated future income of the state,  
22 and so that comprehensive state-wide programs are consistent  
23 and are included within the governor's budget submitted to  
24 the general assembly.

25 4. Provide technical assistance as requested by state  
26 agencies.

27 5. Contract and enter into interagency agreements with  
28 state agencies in developing plans and programs.

29 6. Contract with universities, consultants, and other  
30 public and private agencies, in developing plans and pro-  
31 grams.

32 7. Design, establish, and maintain a state resource  
33 center for compiling information, data, and other materials,  
34 which will be available at the request of the governor, the  
35 general assembly, state agencies, and local governments to

1 aid in formulating, developing, adopting, and implementing  
2 plans and programs.

3 8. Analyze the quality and quantity of services required  
4 for the orderly growth of the state, taking into considera-  
5 tion the relationship of activities, capabilities, and future  
6 plans of local governments, private enterprise, the state  
7 and federal government, and regional units established under  
8 any state or federal legislation, and make recommendations  
9 to the governor and the general assembly for the establish-  
10 ment and improvement of such services.

11 9. Work to harmonize the planning activities of all state  
12 agencies.

13 10. Consult with and advise state agencies concerning  
14 plans and programs filed with the federal government relative  
15 to any existing, new, expanded, or amended federal aid pro-  
16 gram.

17 11. Provide assistance to the general assembly or any of  
18 its committees, when requested.

19 12. Apply for, receive, administer, and utilize federal  
20 or other funds available for achieving the purposes of this  
21 Act.

22 12. Inquire into methods of planning and program develop-  
23 ment, and the conduct of affairs of state government; pre-  
24 scribe adequate systems of records for planning and program-  
25 ming purposes; prescribe the establishment and implementation  
26 of standards for effective planning and programming; and  
27 exercise all other powers necessary in discharging the  
28 powers and duties prescribed by this Act.

29 14. Develop and submit other plans, programs, and reports,  
30 as directed by the governor.

31 15. Compile and maintain current information on available  
32 and pending federal and private aid programs, and make such  
33 information available to state agencies and local governments.

34 16. Provide assistance, as requested, to state agencies  
35 and local governments in preparing applications for federal

1 or private aid.

2 17. Compile and maintain current information relating to  
3 the amount of federal and private aid being received and dis-  
4 bursed by state agencies and local governments; report an-  
5 nually to the governor and the general assembly on such  
6 receipts and disbursements during the preceding fiscal year,  
7 and on the adequacy of programs financed by federal and pri-  
8 vate aid in this state.

9 18. Analyze the relations of federal and private aid pro-  
10 grams with state and locally financed programs and make rec-  
11 ommendations to state agencies, local governments, the gov-  
12 ernor, and the general assembly on means of avoiding dupli-  
13 cation of activity and of increasing efficiency in programs  
14 financed by federal or private aid.

15 Sec. 4. All state agencies and officers and all local  
16 governments and officers shall provide the office of plan-  
17 ning and programming with any information it requests per-  
18 taining to its duties under this Act, shall assist the of-  
19 fice in carrying out its duties, and shall provide the office  
20 with a copy of all official grant-in-aid applications, to-  
21 gether with a copy of any program plan developed to meet  
22 federal requirements, prior to submission of such applica-  
23 tion to the federal government.

24 Sec. 5. The governor shall review, examine, and evaluate  
25 all plans and programs filed with the office for planning  
26 and programming. If it is determined that any two or more  
27 plans or programs are contradictory or duplicate one another,  
28 the governor shall determine which plan or program shall  
29 prevail and which contradictory items or duplications shall  
30 be deleted from the other plans or programs. The governor's  
31 decision on such matters shall be final and binding. The  
32 governor shall also determine whether the services or aid  
33 can be rendered from various central locations throughout  
34 the state and, if so, he shall so direct. The office for  
35 planning and programming shall thereafter assist the state

1 agency concerned in implementing the manner in which services  
2 or aid are to be rendered from the various central locations.  
3 The governor shall make the final decision as to how such  
4 services or aid shall be rendered and his decision shall be  
5 final and binding.

6 **Sec. 6.** A division of municipal affairs shall be estab-  
7 lished within the office for planning and programming. The  
8 division shall:

9 1. Contract for, receive, and utilize grants or other  
10 financial assistance made available by the state, federal  
11 government, or any other public or private sources for per-  
12 forming the functions of the division. Nothing in this sub-  
13 section shall prevent or impair the powers of other state  
14 agencies or local governments to contract for, receive, or  
15 utilize grants directly from the federal or local governments  
16 or from any other public or private source.

17 2. Provide planning assistance and coordination, upon  
18 request, to local and regional planning units. All present  
19 governmental units who engage in planning activities which  
20 are supported by local, state, or federal funds shall in no  
21 way be affected, prevented, or impaired in such planning  
22 activities.

23 3. Perform such other functions and activities as are  
24 consistent with the general purposes of this Act.

EXPLANATION OF SENATE FILE 649

This bill establishes by statute the office for planning and programming which was created pursuant to Executive Order Number Eight of the governor dated August 24, 1967. The duties of the office and its relationship with state agencies are patterned closely after the functions outlined in the above Executive Order. The office is to be attached to the office of the governor and, with the exception of the director and his first assistant (who shall serve at the pleasure of the governor), its employees will be subject to the merit system. The bill further requires that a division of municipal affairs be established within the office to provide planning assistance to municipalities and to any regional governmental units hereafter established.

Requested by Senator Clarke.

Prepared in regard to a bill for an act relating to the establishment of an office for planning and programming to promote coordination of efforts of state agencies and local governments under the office of the governor.

Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Rule 47:

Senate File 649 appears to be similar to Senate File 501, therefore the fiscal note filed on Senate File 501 will also pertain to Senate File 649.

Section 3, subsection 7, of Senate File 649 calls for the design, establishment and maintenance of a "state resource center." If this language means the creation of a special section within the office to collect information on all pertinent areas, and produce such information on request, then, it seems the staff of the office might require an increase in personnel to meet these duties. If the intent of the language is to provide information collected through normal research on projects and studies, when requested, then this should impose no great strain on the staff, nor foster a request for additional personnel.

The fiscal note submitted on Senate File 501 spelled out some of the reasons that make it difficult to project the annual cost of operating the office for planning and programming for a year. It seems probable, the information submitted on the fiscal note for Senate File 501, would hold true for Senate File 649.
