A BILL FOR

1 An Act to appropriate from moneys received by the department of
2 public safety motor vehicle dealers license fee fund.

3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

4 Section 1. For the department of public safety motor
5 vehicle dealers license fee fund, there is hereby appropriated
6 all funds received under authority of chapter three hundred
7 twenty-two (322) of the Code, for the biennium beginning July
8 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971. The following amount, or so
9 much thereof as may be necessary, is authorized to be expended
10 from said receipts for each year of the biennium to be used in
11 the manner designated:

12 For salaries, support, maintenance, equipment
13 and miscellaneous purposes\$91,110.00

14 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund referred to in section
15 one (1) of this Act is hereby appropriated for contingencies
16 arising during the biennium which are legally payable from the
17 fund.

18 Sec. 3. A contingency shall exclude any purpose or project
19 which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill
20 and which failed to become enacted into law, however, for the
21 purpose of this Act a necessity of additional operating funds
22 may be construed as a contingency.

23 Sec. 4. Before any of the funds appropriated by this Act
24 shall be allocated for contingencies it shall be determined by
25 the executive council that contingency exists and that the

1 proposed allocation shall be for the best interest of the
2 state.

3 Sec. 5. If the full amount authorized in section one (1)
4 is not expended during the first year, the unused portion shall
5 carry forward and be an addition to the amount authorized for
6 the second year of the biennium.

7 Sec. 6. The provisions of chapter eight (8) of the Code
8 shall apply to this Act.

9 Sec. 7. Where any of the laws of this state are in conflict
10 with this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the
11 biennium.
