A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act to appropriate the fish and game protection fund for
- 2 use by the state conservation commission.
- 3 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*
- 4 Section 1. The state fish and game protection fund is
- 5 hereby appropriated for use by the state conservation commis-
- 6 sion for the biennium beginning July 1, 1969 and ending June
- 7 30, 1971. The following amount, or so much thereof as may be
- 8 necessary, is authorized to be expended from said fund for
- 9 each year of the biennium, to be used in the following manner:
- 10 For salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,
- 11 and miscellaneous purposes, including transfers
- 12 not to exceed six hundred forty-one thousand
- 13 eighty (641,080) dollars to the administration
- 14 fund in compliance with the provisions of sec-
- 15 tion one hundred seven point seventeen (107.17)
- 16 of the Code and including for lake survey and
- 17 mapping purposes a sum not to exceed sixteen
- 18 thousand (16,000) dollars\$3,175,980
- 19 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund is hereby appropriated
- 20 for capital improvements and contingencies arising during the
- 21 biennium which are legally payable from the fish and game pro-
- 22 tection fund.
- 23 Sec. 3. A contingency shall exclude any purpose or project
- 24 which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill
- 25 and which failed to become enacted into law, provided, however,

1 that for the purpose of this Act a necessity of unforeseen
2 additional operating funds may be construed as a contingency.

3 Sec. 4. Before any of the funds appropriated by this Act
4 shall be allocated for contingencies it shall be determined by
5 the executive council that a contingency exists and that the
6 proposed allocation shall be for the best interest of the
7 state.

8 Sec. 5. All refunds and reimbursements, including federal
9 moneys, received during the biennium shall be credited directly
10 to the fish and game protection fund.

11 Sec. 6. If the full amount authorized in section one (1)
12 is not expended during the first year of the biennium, the
13 unused portion shall carry forward and be an addition to the
14 amount authorized for the second year of the biennium.

15 Sec. 7. When the state conservation commission has approved
16 a capital improvement project to be financed from the fish and
17 game protection fund, a description of the project and esti-
18 mated cost shall be reported to the governor and state comp-
19 troller for allocation of funds.

20 Sec. 8. The provisions of chapter eight (8), of the Code
21 shall apply to this Act.

1 Amend Senate File 673 by adding a new section on page 2, after
2 line 21, as follows:

3 1. Section one hundred and ten point one (110.1), Code 1966, as
4 amended by Chapter one hundred and forty-one (141), Section one
5 (1),

6 Acts of the Sixty-second General Assembly, is hereby further amended
7 by striking lines twelve (12) and thirteen (13) and inserting in lieu
8 thereof the following:

9 "All persons legal residents of the state, sixty-four years
10 of age or younger, except as otherwise provided\$3.00.

11 All persons legal residents of the state, sixty-five years
of age or older, except as otherwise provided\$1.00."
