SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Joint Resolution to make an appropriation to the college of
- 2 osteopathic medicine and surgery.
- 3 WHEREAS, there is a recognized need in Iowa for more family
- 4 doctors; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the college of osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 6 located in Des Moines, Polk County, Iowa, since 1898 has a
- 7 demonstrated record of training family doctors, a significant
- 8 percentage of whom do locate in Iowa and practice as family
- 9 doctors in Iowa's smaller communities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the college of osteopathic medicine and surgery
- 11 has secured a grant from the United States government in the
- 12 amount of eight million five hundred forty-eight thousand dol-
- 13 lars as fifty-three and forty-three hundredths percent of the
- 14 current estimated cost of constructing and equipping an enlarged
- 15 teaching and training facility for family doctors on property
- 16 presently owned by the college at Fort Des Moines; and
- 17 WHEREAS, this offer will terminate on April 2, 1971, if not
- 18 matched with funds from other sources; and
- 19 WHEREAS, this federal grant was made by the department of
- 20 health, education, and welfare, after comprehensive and sus-
- 21 tained study as to the ability of this Iowa institution to
- 22 train more family doctors is more physical capacity to accept
- 23 more students who desire to become family doctors was made
- 24 available; and
- 25 WHEREAS, six times as many college graduates annually do

1 apply for admission to this medical institution than can be
2 accepted, and a significant percentage of those denied admit-
3 tance show interest in serving as family doctors; and

4 WHEREAS, the college of osteopathic medicine and surgery
5 does have the experience, the curriculum, the necessary patient
6 volume for clinical study, a faculty of competent instructors,
7 and the evidenced desire to train more family doctors, and is
8 presently lending its best efforts toward raising as much of
9 the required matching funds as possible from its faculty, alum-
10 ni, interested trusts and organizations, the professional and
11 business interests of greater Des Moines, and of Iowa, and
12 wherever such funds can be procured; and

13 WHEREAS, it does appear that these several fund drives will
14 fall several million dollars short of achieving matching funds
15 of forty-six and fifty-six hundredths percent of the sixteen
16 million dollars required to build and equip the structure re-
17 quired to serve an expanding student body; NOW THEREFORE,
18 *Be It Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

19 Section 1. That it is the sense of the general assembly
20 that there shall be appropriated to the executive council from
21 the general fund of the state, the sum of four million (4,000,000)
22 dollars, from which sum the executive council shall pay to the
23 college of osteopathic medicine and surgery, Polk County, Des
24 Moines, Iowa, whatever portion of this amount is needed to com-
25 plete the building and construction of the proposed facility.
26 Moneys shall be paid when needed as construction progresses on
27 the building.

EXPLANATION

This resolution provides an appropriation of up to \$4,000,000 as match-
ing funds to permit the construction of a new facility for training family
doctors by the College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery.
