SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Joint Resolution to continue the "Iowa State Fair and World
- 2 Food Exposition Study Committee" established by the Sixty-
- 3 first General Assembly, and to make an appropriation there-
- 4 for.
- 5 WHEREAS, the citizens of Iowa have expressed interest in
- 6 the state of Iowa serving as host for a world food exposition;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Iowa food producers, food processors, manufacturers
- 9 of food processing, and related manufacturing and industry
- 10 will benefit from a world food exposition; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the United States and the world could benefit from
- 12 a properly planned and executed world food exposition; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the "Iowa State Fair and World Food Exposition
- 14 Study Committee" and expert resource persons studied during
- 15 the Sixty-first and Sixty-second General Assembly interims the

1 feasibility of Iowa hosting a world food exposition and have
2 determined that a properly planned and executed world food
3 exposition is feasible; NOW THEREFORE,

4 *Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

5 Section 1. The "Iowa State Fair and World Food Exposition
6 Study Committee" established by the Sixty-first General Assem-
7 bly is hereby continued.

8 Sec. 2. The committee is empowered to communicate with the
9 federal government and others and to indicate the desire of
10 Iowa citizens to cooperate with others, to communicate with
11 private companies, public organizations, and others indicating
12 the reasons for and advantages of having a world food exposi-
13 tion in Iowa. The committee is empowered to explore methods
14 of developing a world food exposition and to do those things
15 the committee deems advisable to sustain and increase interest
16 in a world food exposition.

17 Sec. 3. The committee shall make a progress report and
18 recommendations to the second session of the Sixty-third
19 General Assembly. All recommendations to be accompanied by
20 bills, where necessary.

21 Sec. 4. There is hereby appropriated from any funds of the
22 state not otherwise appropriated the sum of two thousand five
23 hundred (2,500) dollars, or so much thereof as may be neces-
24 sary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

EXPLANATION OF SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 24

Progress made by the Iowa State Fair and World Food Exposition Study Committee indicates the feasibility of a world food exposition. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the state of Iowa to continue to make plans for a future time when the federal government and others may be seeking a location for a world food exposition. The committee should be continued in order that Iowa can take immediate advantage of any opportunity that may become available.

1 Amend Senate Joint Resolution 24 as follows:
2 By inserting in page 2, line 7, after the word
3 "continued" the following words ", except that the
4 members of the committee representing the General
5 Assembly shall, after the effective date of this
6 Act, include the president of the Senate, one senator
7 appointed by him from a different political party, the
8 speaker of the House and one member of the House
9 appointed by him from the minority party".
