A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to fees collected by the county recorder for
2 hunting and fishing duplicate licenses.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

4 Section 1. Section one hundred ten point seven (110.7),
5 Code 1971, is amended as follows:

6 110.7 DUPLICATE LICENSES AND PERMITS. Whenever any
7 license, certificate or permit, for which a fee has been set,
8 has been lost, destroyed or stolen, the director or the county
9 recorder where the license was issued in the first instance,
10 may issue a certificate to replace said license, if written
11 evidence is filed with either director or recorder, in affi-
12 davit form, by the person to whom the original was issued,
13 setting forth the circumstances and accompanied by a fee of
14 twenty-five-cents one dollar, said fee to be kept by the county
15 recorder for the use of the county, if issued by him, and
16 placed in the fish and game protection fund if issued by the
17 director. If, on examination of the evidence, the director or
18 the recorder, as the case may be, is satisfied that said
19 license has been lost, destroyed or stolen, he shall issue a
20 duplicate license which shall be plainly marked "duplicate"
21 and said duplicate shall serve in lieu of the original license
22 and it shall contain the same information and signature as the
23 original.

EXPLANATION

25

Fees for duplicate hunting and fishing licenses have not

1 been raised since 1939. A search of the triplicate license
2 file in the Recorder's Office is necessary before a duplicate
3 license can be issued and this involves a great deal of time
4 and work. These fees are kept by the county and not sent to
5 the conservation commission and this would be more in line with
6 the amount of work spent on these duplicate licenses by county
7 employees.
