1 An Act relating to traffic control signals.
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
3 Section 1. Section three hundred twenty-one point two
4 hundred fifty-seven (321.257), subsection three (3), Code 1971,
5 is amended by striking such subsection and inserting in lieu
6 thereto the following:

3. RED ALONE OR "STOP"

8 Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal alone shall
9 stop at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering
10 the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or if none,
11 then before entering the intersection, and shall remain standing
12 until an indication to proceed is shown. A right turn shall
13 be permitted at an intersection by vehicular traffic which has
14 come to a complete stop, whenever a sign is in place permitting
15 such turn. Any right turn made pursuant to this subsection
16 shall be made in such a manner that it does not interfere with
17 other vehicular or pedestrian traffic lawfully using the inter-
18 section.

19 No pedestrian facing a traffic control signal shall enter
20 the roadway unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control
21 signal and can do so safely without interfering with any
22 vehicular traffic.

EXPLANATION

24 This bill amends the present law regarding traffic-control
25 signals by permitting a right turn by a vehicle after stopping

1 at a stop signal, when a sign is in place permitting such turn
2 and such turn does not interfere with oncoming vehicular
3 traffic or pedestrians using the intersection.
