A BILL FOR

1 An Act to appropriate from moneys received by the department of
2 public safety motor vehicle dealers license fee fund.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated and the commissioner
2 of public safety may expend from the money received by the
3 department of public safety under section three hundred twenty-
4 two point twelve (322.12) of the Code, known as the motor
5 vehicle dealers license fee fund, for each year of the biennium
6 beginning July 1, 1971 and ending June 30, 1973 the following
7 amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used
8 for the following purposes:

9 10 11 For salaries, support, main- 12 tenance and miscellaneous 13 purposes:	\$108,420.00	\$112,120.00

14 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund referred to in section
15 one (1) of this Act is appropriated and may be expended by
16 the commissioner of public safety for contingencies arising
17 during the biennium which are legally payable from the fund.

18 Sec. 3. A contingency shall exclude any purpose or project
19 which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill
20 and which failed to become enacted into law, however, for
21 the purpose of this Act a necessity of additional operating
22 funds may be construed as a contingency.

23 Sec. 4. Before any of the funds authorized to be expended
24 by this Act shall be allocated for contingencies it shall
25 be determined by the executive council that a contingency
26 exists and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best
27 interest of the state.

28 Sec. 5. The reversion of funds appropriated by this Act
29 which are unexpended and unencumbered shall be governed by
30 the provisions of section three hundred twenty-two point
31 twelve (322.12) of the Code.

32 Sec. 6. When any of the laws of this state are in conflict
33 with this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for
34 the biennium.
