Item Veto on Sec. 7

1 Section 1. There is appropriated the state fish and game
2 protection fund for use by the state conservation commission
3 for the biennium beginning July 1, 1971 and ending June 30,
4 1973. The following amounts, or so much thereof as may be
5 necessary, are authorized to be expended from said fund to
6 be used for the following purposes, to wit:

10 For salaries, support, mainten-
11 ance, equipment and miscellaneous
12 purposes, including not more than
13 six hundred fifty-eight thousand
14 nine hundred fifty (658,950) dol-
15 lars for the fiscal year ending
16 June 30, 1972 and six hundred
17 sixty-four thousand four hundred
18 (664,400) dollars for the fiscal
19 year ending June 30, 1973 which
20 shall be available from the state
21 fish and game protection fund for
22 the administration fund in compli-
23 ance with the provisions of sec-
24 tion one hundred seven point
25 seventeen (107.17) of the Code:

26 Sec. 2. The remainder of the state fish and game protection
27 fund is appropriated for capital improvements and contingen-
28 cies arising during the biennium which are legally payable
29 from the fish and game protection fund.

30 Sec. 3. A contingency shall exclude any purpose or project
31 which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill
32 and which failed to become enacted into law, however, for
33 the purposes of this Act an unforeseen necessity of additional
34 operating funds may be construed as a contingency.

35 Sec. 4. Before any of the funds appropriated by this Act

1 shall be allocated for contingencies it shall be determined
2 by the executive council that a contingency exists and that
3 the proposed allocation shall be for the best interest of
4 the state.

5 Sec. 5. All refunds and reimbursements, including federal
6 moneys, received during the biennium shall be credited to
7 the state fish and game protection fund.

8 Sec. 6. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
9 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or
10 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for
11 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1971
12 shall, on September 30, 1972 revert to the state treasury
13 and to the credit of the fund from which appropriated. In
14 all other respects the provisions of section eight point
15 thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to appropriations
16 made for the first fiscal year of the biennium. Unencumbered
17 or unobligated balances of appropriations made for the second
18 fiscal year of such biennium shall be subject to section eight
19 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

20 Sec. 7. When the state conservation commission has approved
21 a capital improvement project to be financed from the state
22 fish and game protection fund, a description of the project
23 and estimated cost shall be reported to the budget and
24 financial control committee for approval. Upon approval
25 by the budget and financial control committee, the project
26 shall be reported to the governor and state comptroller for
27 allocation of funds.

28 Sec. 8. Where any of the laws of this state are in con-
29 flict with this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern
30 for the biennium.
