A BILL FOR

1 An Act making an appropriation from the general fund of the
2 state to the department of public defense for various
3 capital improvements.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state of Iowa to the department of public defense,
3 the sum of one hundred twenty-eight thousand, two hundred
4 sixty (128,260) dollars, or so much thereof as may be nec-
5 essary, to be used by the state to match federal funds avail-
6 able under the armory construction program for the acquisi-
7 tion, construction, expansion, rehabilitation and conversion
8 of facilities for the administration and training units of
9 the national guard and state guard.

10 Sec. 2. Before any of the funds appropriated by this Act
11 shall be expended, it shall be determined by the department
12 of public defense with the approval of the governor and the
13 state comptroller that the expenditures shall be for the best
14 interests of the state.

15 Sec. 3. The department of public defense, the governor
16 and the state comptroller may obtain federal grants to the
17 state to be used in connection with the funds appropriated
18 by this Act. All federal grants to the state obtained by
19 the department of public defense, the governor and the state
20 comptroller are appropriated for the purpose set forth in
21 the federal grants.

22 Sec. 4. Any unencumbered balance of funds appropriated
23 by this Act remaining as of June 30, 1975, shall revert to
24 the general fund of the state as of June 30, 1975.

25 EXPLANATION

26 An Iowa army national guard armory-hangar complex was
27 programmed for construction for fiscal year 1974 with federal
28 funding support in accordance with the provisions of the
29 "National Defense Facilities Act of 1950" (P.L. 783-81st Con-
30 gress). The current department of defense policy of deemphasis
31 of the draft and implementation of the "total forces" concept,
32 with resulting reductions of overall strengths of the active
33 forces and increased reliance on the combat and combat sup-
34 port capabilities of the national guard and other reserve
35 components has resulted in earlier allocation of federal fund-

1 ing support for the facility with implementation during fiscal
2 year 1973.

3 The projected new facility will support Troop D (Air) 1st
4 Squadron of the 194th Cavalry which will be equipped with
5 rotary wing aircraft and this expanded equipment basis will
6 be manned by present members of active service personnel for
7 assignment to reserve components. The presently leased
8 facility is inadequate to support this projected equipment
9 basis and resulting increase of that personnel and maintenance
10 requirement and it is also feared that the present federal
11 funding support will not be available during the fiscal period
12 commencing July 1, 1974.

13 The total cost of the facility will exceed one million
14 dollars of which the federal funding support will amount to
15 \$913,800.00 and the matching state funding requirement will
16 total \$105,825.00. An additional \$22,435 is required in the
17 army construction program, due to shortfall and unanticipated
18 increased costs, in the present program, making the total
19 required \$128,260.00 for state funding or 12% of the new
20 Armory-Hangar complex.

21 The site for the project has been provided at no cost to
22 the state of Iowa.

12 transport emergency medical supplies, equipment or
13 personnel.

14 The Iowa national guard shall provide the emergen-
15 cy helicopter ambulance service from its available
16 manned helicopters at the request of the governor,
17 Iowa highway safety patrol, or the administrative heads
18 of the hospitals located in Iowa, unless the Iowa
19 national guard does not have a manned helicopter
20 available or is in active service under the armed
21 forces of the United States.

22 The adjutant general shall establish policies and
23 procedures to carry out the provisions of this section.
24 The policies and procedures shall provide that the
25 emergency helicopter ambulance service shall be
26 coordinated and supplemental
27 to, and not competitive with conventional ambulance
28 services. In determining whether an emergency exists
29 the policies and procedures shall give reasonable
30 consideration to the risk of death or permanent injury
31 due to delayed treatment resulting from; remoteness
32 of an area from any hospital, the absence or
33 unavailability of conventional ambulance services,
34 and the distance to be traveled in a transfer between
35 hospitals."

36 3. Page 1, line 3, by amending the title by insert-
37 ing after the word "improvements" the words ", and
38 providing for emergency helicopter ambulance service".

9 the Iowa national guard for an emergency helicopter
10 ambulance service to transport persons who require emergency
11 medical treatment or require emergency transfer between
12 hospitals and to transport emergency medical supplies,
13 equipment or personnel.
14 The Iowa national guard shall be requested to provide the
15 emergency helicopter ambulance service from its available
16 manned helicopters when the plan is implemented on order
17 of the governor at the request of the Iowa highway safety
18 patrol, or the administrative heads of the hospitals
19 located in Iowa, unless the Iowa national guard does not have
20 a manned helicopter available or is in active service under
21 the armed forces of the United States.
22 The adjutant general shall establish policies and
23 procedures to carry out the provisions of this section. The
24 policies and procedures shall provide that the emergency
25 helicopter ambulance service shall be coordinated and
