1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund  
2 of the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 1971 and end-  
3 ing June 30, 1973, for the department of social services,  
4 including the board of parole, for all purposes including  
5 public assistance, salaries, support, maintenance, repairs,  
6 replacement, alterations, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes  
7 for the department's general administration, bureau offices,  
8 institutions, welfare services, and parole services the fol-  
9 lowing amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to  
10 be used in the manner designated:

28 Sec. 2. The budget of total expenditures for each institu-

29 tion under the department of social services during the bien-

30 nium shall not exceed the state appropriation and transfers

31 under section eight point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code for

32 each institution set forth in this Act, except that the gross

33 expenditure shall be adjusted by the maintenance recovery

34 from employees and receipts for individuals not sentenced,

35 jail offenders of less than one year, work releases, and

1 contracts with federal bureau of prisons for persons assigned  
2 to correctional institutions, in arriving at the total  
3 expenditure. Receipts from farm products may be used for  
4 farm expenses and repairs as needed with profits deposited  
5 in the state general fund.

6 Maintenance recovery is the rental charge to employees  
7 and inmates for room, apartment or house and meals.

8 All other institutional receipts shall be deposited in  
9 the state general fund.

10 Sec. 3. The department may use appropriated funds for  
11 the granting of educational leave upon approval of the com-  
12 missioner.

13 Sec. 4. The mental health institutes daily per diem as  
14 determined by section two hundred thirty point twenty (230.20),  
15 Code 1971, shall be billed at eighty percent for the biennium.

16 Sec. 5. The state hospital schools' daily per diem as  
17 determined by section two hundred twenty-two point seventy-  
18 three (222.73), Code 1971, shall be billed at eighty percent  
19 for the biennium.

20 Sec. 6. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be used  
21 for capital improvements.

22 Sec. 7. Where the provisions of sections two hundred  
23 thirty-nine point twelve (239.12) and two hundred forty-one  
24 point twenty-one (241.21) of the Code, or any other provision  
25 of the laws of this state are in conflict with this Act in  
26 designating certain fund accounts to be used for certain  
27 purposes, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the  
28 biennium.

29 Sec. 8. Any balance remaining in the funds to which ap-  
30 propriations are made by this Act, at the end of the ensuing  
31 biennium, shall revert to the general fund of the state except  
32 that balances not to exceed the following specified amounts  
33 may be retained in the following funds:

34	Aid to the blind fund:	\$ 60,000.00
35	Aid to dependent children fund:	\$1,200,000.00

1           Aid to the disabled fund:                   \$ 105,000.00

2       Sec. 9. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight  
3 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or  
4 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for  
5 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1971  
6 shall, on September 30, 1972, revert to the state treasury,  
7 except funds appropriated in subsection five (5) of section  
8 one (1) for assistance grants, and to the credit of the fund  
9 from which appropriated. The department or board may make  
10 application to the committees on appropriations for the  
11 reapportionment of any funds that do revert, or probably will  
12 revert upon the dates herein set and the respective committees  
13 on appropriations or a subcommittee thereof shall hold a  
14 hearing upon such application while the general assembly is  
15 in regular session. In all other respects the provisions  
16 of section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall  
17 apply to appropriations made for the first fiscal year of  
18 such biennium. Unencumbered or unobligated balances of  
19 appropriations made for the second fiscal year of such biennium  
20 shall be subject to section eight point thirty-three (8.33)  
21 of the Code.

22       Sec. 10. All federal grants to and the federal receipts  
23 of the agencies receiving funds under this Act are appro-  
24 priated for the purpose set forth in the federal grants or  
25 receipts.

26       Sec. 11. No person shall be admitted on a voluntary basis  
27 to a mental health institute under the control of the  
28 department of social services for the treatment of alcoholism  
29 unless he has been admitted to a facility defined in section  
30 one hundred twenty-three B point one (123B.1) of the Code,  
31 and referred by the facility to the mental health institute.

32       Sec. 12. Section two hundred forty-one point four (241.4),  
33 Code 1971, is amended by striking subsection two (2).

34       Sec. 13. Section two hundred forty-nine point one (249.1),  
35 Code 1971, is amended by striking subsection four (4).

1       Sec. 14. Section three hundred thirty-two point seventeen  
2 (332.17), Code 1971, is amended by striking subsection ten  
3 (10).

4       Sec. 15. Sections two hundred thirty-four point thirteen  
5 (234.13) and two hundred forty-nine point four (249.4), Code  
6 1971, are repealed.
