A BILL FOR

1 An Act to make an appropriation from the general fund of the
2 state to the executive council for a training facility
3 for family practitioners at Broadlawns Polk County
4 Hospital.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section three
2 point fourteen (3.14) of the Code, there is appropriated from
3 the general fund of the state to the executive council effec-
4 tive July 1, 1971, the sum of one hundred seventy-five thou-
5 sand (\$175,000.00) dollars, to be paid by the executive council
6 to Broadlawns Polk County Hospital, Des Moines, Iowa, to be
7 used for the development of final plans, specifications, con-
8 struction, and equipping of a model family practice clinic
9 unit and necessary supporting services. The appropriation
10 shall be contingent upon Broadlawns Polk County Hospital
11 obtaining at least an additional one hundred fifty thousand
12 dollars to be provided from other than state funds.

13 Sec. 2. Any unencumbered balance of the funds appropri-
14 ated by this Act remaining on June 30, 1973, shall revert
15 to the general fund of the state.

16 EXPLANATION

17 The purpose of this nonrecurring capital expenditure is
18 to develop a postgraduate training center of high quality
19 which emphasizes the training of family practice physicians.
20 The College of Medicine in Iowa City has started a new De-
21 partment of Family Practice Medicine. Broadlawns Polk County
22 Hospital is formally affiliated with the College of Medicine.
23 To be accredited for a family practice residency it is re-
24 quired to build and operate a model family practice clinic
25 which will simulate the actual office practice the physician
26 will one day begin.

27 This one-time appropriation will not only permit the nec-
28 essary accreditation of the family practice residency but
29 will be used to train medical students at the College of Medi-
30 cine in family practice, will be instrumental in attracting
31 and retaining at least twelve residents in family practice
32 and will constitute a dramatic step in obtaining more family
33 practitioners for the State of Iowa.

34 This Act provides an appropriation of \$175,000, effective
35 July 1, 1971, as matching funds to permit the construction

1 of a model family practice clinic unit and necessary support-
2 ing services at Broadlawns Polk County Hospital. This ap-
3 propriation is contingent upon obtaining matching funds of
4 at least \$150,000 from other than state funds. Broadlawns
5 has already applied for a \$150,000 grant from Hill-Harris
6 funds.
